The Colt show which was mentioned some weeks ago to be held at Trenton, was well attended.

The week previous had been rainy and the bad roads prevented a number from being present with their colts. The contest was open to the get of any stallion west of Williston in Williams county. Said portion of this county can boast of several stallions costing \$3,000 and more.

The judges chosen were W. W. Keltner, Henry Hinch and Ernest Scott. The first premium was awarded to Marion Simmons, a filly foaled May 18, weight 710 pounds, sired by Pompey.

Second premium awarded to George Simmons—horse colt, weight 770 pounds, sired by Pompey, owned by W. P. Thorntun. The dams of these colts are good, average farm mares with no draft blood.

The third premium was awarded to Louis Moran—horse colt, weight 690 pounds, sired by horse known as the Buford Co. horse, costing his owner better than three thousand dollars. The dam of this colt has no draft blood. Taking in consideration the style and action, these colts would be hard to beat at the state fair. We hope to see a like occasion at the same place next year. **
