HUNTED; KILLS SELF

Carmichael, Pastor-Slayer, Commits Suicide.

CONFESSES CHURCH MURDER

Michigan Minister Apprehended at Carthage, Ill., Dies in Hands of Police, After Telling Whole Story—Wife Denies Hypnotic Knowledge.

Burlington, Ia., Jan. 1.—Rev. John Carmichael, who confessed to the murder at Rattle Run Methodist church, Port Huron, Mich., was found in an outhouse at Carthage, Ill., yesterday, half dead from loss of blood and exposure to the cold. He had cut his throat, severing his jugular vein in an attempt to commit suicide, which proved successful, for he died yesterday afternoon. Carmichael had admitted to pass the evening, and took a room at the boarding house. He had stated that he intended to start a factory, and called on the local Catholic priest, stating that he was a Catholic, and wanted to enlist the interests of the members of that church in his enterprise.

Sheriff Has Pastor's Confession. He told the boarding house proprietor that he did not like the location.

and would take the morning train for Bowen, Ill. Some time afterwards he was found in the outhouse. Sheriff Bertsch said over the telephone this afternoon that he would not give out the contents of the letter until later, as it was addressed to the sheriff of Rattle Run, Mich., and he was holding it subject to release by wire.

His Wife is Surprised. Adair, Mich., Jan. 12.—"Really! Really! Have they really found him?" was Mrs. Carmichael's exclamation when told that her husband had been found in Carthage, Ill. She took the news calmly; in fact, seemed almost relieved to know that the much-sought man had been located. "I know of no reason why he should have gone to Carthage," she continued. "He had no relatives there and no friends that I ever knew of. I never heard of Carthage before and know nothing of the place."

Denies Hypnotic Knowledge. When told that her husband in his letter said that he had committed the murder of Browning while under her hypnotic influence, Mrs. Carmichael declared that she knew nothing of hypnotism; that her husband, so far as she knew, was also ignorant of it; and that hypnotism had never been discussed in their home. "I never saw a person hypnotized," she said, "and know absolutely nothing about the practice. And if my husband made such a statement in a letter I cannot imagine the reason for it."

Believes He Was Crazy. "I would not think that Mr. Browning, either, would have known anything of mesmerism or hypnotism. I never spoke of Mr. Browning to my husband and my husband never spoke of him to me. I never said any more than how do you do to Mr. Browning. I never was in their house."

"He would naturally take some interest in everybody like that. Now, if Mr. Carmichael did anything to Mr. Browning my husband must have been crazy. Why, he didn't have an enemy. He never showed any anger to any one; he controlled himself. He never struck a man or was in a fight. He couldn't have been aroused over any action of the people here, for everybody was kind to us from the first. I have often been afraid that the gatherings in my husband's ears would cause his death or make him insane."

No Excitement Among Electors. Sacramento, Cal., Jan. 12.—The ten presidential electors of California met here yesterday and cast their votes for president and vice-president of the United States. This year there was little excitement attached to the formality.
