

MANY LORIMER BANKS TIED UP

CHAIN OF LORIMER BANKS TIED UP AS RESULT OF RUN ON LaSALLE BANK

Chicago, June 12.—The LaSalle Street Trust & Savings bank of which former Senator William Lorimer is president was taken in charge by the state bank examiner. No business was done in the bank today. The examiner reported that conditions were such as to warrant the closing of the bank.

A mild run on the bank was started two days ago, according to the secretary of the bank, today more and more depositors gathered in front of the institution which is a few doors from the board of trade building in LaSalle street. An hour after the arrival of the state bank examiner, doors of the bank closed.

An examination of subsidiaries of the LaSalle Street bank, it was announced, will be taken up by the bank examiner. Later, the state bank examiners caused a suspension of business in three subsidiaries of the La Salle street institution. These were the Broadway State bank on the north side, the Ashland bank on the west side in the ghetto district, and the Illinois State bank of Chicago, on North Clark street. The Broadway State and Ashland banks were organized within a year.

Chicago, June 13.—The fifth bank was closed today by the state bank examiner in connection with yesterday's disclosure of the conditions of the LaSalle Street Trust and Savings bank.

MEDIATION IS BEING DELAYED

SOUTH AMERICAN ENVOYS FRAMING REPLY TO THE CONSTITUTIONALIST CHIEF

Niagra Falls, Ont., June 16.—Still deadlocked over the question of constitutionalist representation at the conference here, the Mexican and American delegates awaiting more information about the character and ability of certain persons who have been previously suggested to compose the new provisional government.

The Mexican delegates are reporting to their government the developments with reference to the constitutionalist participation, but assert they have no official knowledge on the subject from the mediators.

The American mission has not finished their discussion with the mediators about the constitutionalists, and are awaiting more information from Washington.

Indications are that nothing definite will be resolved on the constitutionalist representation, though the mediators are reported to be framing a reply to the last Carranza note.

The statement from Durango gives the constitutionalists view of the mediation conference, is regarded here as likely to delay rather than hurry the negotiations. While no comment is obtainable, those of the conference who did express themselves pointed to the statement as concrete evidence of a misunderstanding that existed in the minds of constitutionalists as to the character of the negotiations.
