

COMMISSIONERS PROCEEDINGS

OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, WILLIAMS COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

9:00 A. M., Monday, January 3rd, 1916.

Regular meeting. Commissioners present, Hagge and Webb. There not being a quorum of the Board present meeting is hereby adjourned until 2: P. M.

Board convened in regular session. Commissioners present, Webb, Borden and Hagge, absent Lee and Folden. Chairman presiding.

The Auditor proceeded to read minutes of October 1915 meeting and adjourned session, completed same during the afternoon session.

Moved by Commissioner Webb seconded by Commissioner Borden that minutes be approved as read. All Commissioners present voted "Aye." Motion Carried.

Moved by Commissioner Webb seconded by Commissioner Borden that Board adjourn until 9: A. M., Tuesday, January 4th, 1916. All Commissioners present voted "Aye." Motion Carried.

9: A. M., Tuesday, January 4th, 1916.

Board convened as per adjournment. Commissioners present, Hagge, Borden, Webb, Lee and Folden. Chairman presiding.

The first order of business being the election of the chairman of the Board of County Commissioners for the ensuing year.

The vote was by ballot of which Commissioner Lee received three votes, Hagge received one and Folden received one.

Moved by Commissioner Borden seconded by Commissioner Webb that the vote for E. H. Lee be made unanimous and that Commissioner Lee be duly declared elected chairman of the Board of County Commissioners for the ensuing year. All Commissioners present voted "Aye." Motion Carried.

The appointment of official newspapers for the County was deferred until 3: P. M.

The Board proceeded to pass on claims against the County and worked at same during the balance of the forenoon session.

On Motion Board adjourned until 2: P. M.

2: P. M.

Board convened as per adjournment. Commissioners present, Hagge, Borden, Webb, Lee and Folden. Chairman Lee presiding.

The Board resumed passing on claims against the County and worked at same until 3: P. M., when the matter of official newspapers for the county for the ensuing year was taken up.

The vote on official newspapers were made by ballot. There were 5 votes cast, the results being as follows:

The Williston Herald 1 vote. The Williston Graphic 4 votes. The Ray Pioneer 5 votes. The Wildrose Plainman, 5 votes.

Whereupon the Chairman declared the official Newspapers of the County for the ensuing year to be:

The Williston Graphic, The Ray Pioneer, and The Wildrose Plainman.

The Board resumed passing on claims against the County and worked at same during the balance of the afternoon session.

Moved by Commissioner Folden seconded by Commissioner Webb that the following bills be allowed and the Auditor authorized to issue Warrants in payment of same. All Commissioners present voted "Aye." Motion Carried.
