The primary election returns of the county shows that a large vote was cast in the county on the Republican ticket and the N. P. League has lived up to their slogan of "We'll Stick, We'll Win," by nominating practically everyone of their candidates on the ticket both in the county and in the state. Last week when we went to press we were unable to give the complete returns and at that time there looked as if there might be some show for Norton for Congress and Miss Neilson for State Superintendent but later returns show that they were defeated.

It is estimated that Frazer won out for Governor by a majority of about 1600 and that S. J. Doyle was nominated for Governor on the Democratic ticket.


