TO DECIDE ON RUSSIA

May Be Allowed Delegates at the Peace Conference.

Meeting to Tackle Question of Representation at Peace Table—League of Nations First.

Paris, Jan. —Russia may be represented together with all the other nations that were engaged in the war with Germany at the first formal meeting of the peace conference.

Whether Russia will have present at that time a delegation of prominent Russians, irrespective of party, or other spokesmen, if any, probably will be decided at the next meeting preliminary to the congress.

All the delegations with the exception of the French, which will be occupied with parliamentary affairs, will employ their time in preparations for the meeting.

The first question to come up before the actual peace conference will be that of the proposed league of nations and it is made known that it had been planned for the conferees to devote 12 hours daily to this work if necessary until it is on the way to completion.

Woman Alleges Election Law Was Violated in Nevada.

Reno, Nev., Jan. 28.—Charging that the election of Senator Charles S. Henderson in Nevada this year was brought about through violations of the federal and state laws governing expense accounts, Miss Anne Martin, who was an independent candidate in opposition to Senator Henderson, has sent a letter to Senator Pomerene, chairman of the Senate committee on elections, asking him to order an investigation.
