



EDITORIAL NOTES.

Sir Thomas Lipton has so far recovered from his recent illness as to be able to sail, and is well on his way to London.

Albert Beckman, of Butte, Mont., and who murdered his sweetheart Hellen Kelley, of that city, last Thursday has been captured at Melrose, by Sheriff Quinn and cards are out for a necktie party.

Aberdeen, Washington had a \$1,000,000 fire on the 17th, inst., in which many people were injured and four deaths are reported. The business portion of the city was practically destroyed. Aberdeen has a population of about 7,000, their chief industry being the lumber business.

Gov. Toole, of Montana, recently pardoned James R. Stammson, who for a score of years was a resident of St. Paul, Minn., and who was convicted in Teton county for grand larceny and sentenced to 14 years in the penitentiary. The pardon is said to have been granted at the request of Gov. Van Sant and Attorney Farnham of St. Paul, Minn.

The United States naval observatory at Washington made observations of the remarkable group of nine solar spots visible on the face of the sun. The group could easily be seen by the naked eye. Through the help of the photo-heliograph, the individual spots comprising the whole group have become numerous, several of the smaller spots seemed to have consolidated with others of a larger size.

Boris Saroff the Macedonian leader is dead, a dispatch from Salonica states that he was killed at Pouva near Flarnia, Oct. 12th, in a battle with the Turks. Saroff has a romantic history, in a way, having been leader of the insurgents for a number of years, he took up his career after witnessing the death of his father and grandfather by the hands of the Turks when but 15 years of age. It was he who planned the abduction of Miss Ella M. Stone, the American missionary, in 1901 and held her for ransom, the funds being used to manipulate war against the Turks.
