

# HEAD SEVERED FROM UNKNOWN MAN'S BODY

At the Stock Yards near this City, Tuesday—  
Man Evidently was a Resident of this part of the State, but had been Stealing a Ride.

An unknown man, perhaps 25 years of age, was killed by a Great Northern freight train a half-mile west of the stock yards, two miles east of the city, about half-past nine o'clock, Tuesday morning. The fellow had evidently been stealing a ride on the train, but from his appearance he was not a professional hobo. The suit of clothes which he wore was in good condition and they had been purchased from E. H. Boyer, a local clothing man, about two years ago. This leads the authorities to the belief that the man resided in this part of the state, perhaps he was the owner of a homestead. The young man's body was in a horrible condition. The head

had been cut entirely off, one arm was cut off and a leg was terribly mangled. One of the brakemen saw the man's body rolling under the train, but thought it was a dog, until he saw the head roll out on the bank, completely severed from the body. The remains were picked up about noon and brought to this city and were placed in McFennett's morgue, awaiting identification. The clothes were searched, but there was not the slightest clue to his identification on them, unless it was a small note book which contained several addresses. The unfortunate man had reddish hair and appeared to weigh 170 pounds. Coroner Windell did not deem it necessary to hold an inquest.

These fellows do not pay taxes, they do not help build up your towns. All they wish to get is money and fly to some other place. They sell the stoves on personal notes we understand, for two years without interest. But figure this up and see if you are not paying extra high interest. Now we do not condemn the stoves nor the fellows selling them. But remember that you are paying a very big price for what you get and besides if the stove should happen to be inferior, you have no redress. The fellows will be gone and you can do nothing. It is the safest plan every time to buy of your home dealer.

### Davidson Obsèques

The remains of Wm. Davidson father of R. W. Davidson, who passed away Wednesday afternoon, in this city, were laid at rest in Rose Hill cemetery Sunday afternoon, the burial being in charge of the Minot lodge of Masons. It was at his request that his remains were interred in the Minot cemetery and by the Masons, of which lodge he had been a member since 1856, he being a member of the Winona lodge.
