The board of county commissioners of Ward County met in the office of the county auditor on the above date at nine o'clock a. m. Commissioner Swanson in the chair with the following members present: Torbenson, and Elliott. Black and Abbott absent.

Moved by Commissioner Torbenson and seconded by Commissioner Elliott that the auditor be instructed to write the Minneapolis, St. Paul and Sault Ste Marie Railway Co. that on November 21, 1902, a road was legally opened under their trestle work, on section 32, township 161, range 88, a short distance north of their bridge numbered 523 A, which bridge is now being closed by the said railway company, and notify same to open said road. Motion carried.

On motion duly seconded and carried the board adjourned until 2 o'clock p. m.
