

### Ward County Commissioner's Proceedings.

The Board met as per adjournment at 9:00 o'clock a. m., February 3rd, 1913, with all members present. Com. Lokensgard in the chair.

The meeting was called to order and the minutes of the previous meeting were read.

Moved by Com. Sampson that the minutes be approved as corrected. Motion seconded by Com. Sanders and carried.

Moved by Com. Sampson that the requisition of R. E. Hopkins, clerk of the County Court, for twelve common chairs, one office chair and six document file sections be accepted. Motion seconded by Com. Vandenoever and carried.

The board devoted the forenoon to checking up bills and at 12 o'clock adjourned to meet at 2:00 o'clock.

#### Afternoon Session.

The board met as per adjournment at 2 o'clock p. m., with all members present. Com. Lokensgard in the chair.

The board proceeded to check up bills.

Moved by Com. Anderson that the salaries of the deputies and clerks of the office of the Superintendent of Schools be fixed as follows from and after February 1, 1913: Two field deputies at a salary of \$100 per mo. each, and either an office deputy at \$83.33 per month or a stenographer at \$75 per month and that any former resolutions or motions concerning the said salaries of the said deputies are herewith rescinded and cancelled. Motion seconded by Com. Vandenoever and carried.

Moved by Com. Sanders that the board adjourn to meet at 9 o'clock a. m., Tuesday, Feb. 4th, 1913. Motion duly seconded and carried.

#### Tuesday, February 4th.

The board met as per adjournment with all members present. Com. Lokensgard in the chair.

Moved by Com. Sanders that the statement of E. D. Kelley, sheriff of services rendered in criminal actions from January 6th to Feb. 1st,

1913, and also the itemized statement of mileage and livery of sheriff in connection with such criminal actions be accepted and approved and that the auditor be instructed to draw warrant for same. Motion seconded by Com. Vandenoever and carried.

Moved by Com. Sanders that the requisition of L. P. Weatherwax, county treasurer, for two waste paper baskets and the requisition of Chas. Holmes, janitor, for supplies, be accepted and that the auditor be instructed to order the same. Motion seconded by Com. Vandenoever and carried.

Moved by Com. Anderson that the report of E. D. Kelley, sheriff, of fees collected in civil actions from January 6th, 1913, to February 1st, 1913, be accepted and placed on file. Motion seconded by Com. Sanders and carried.

The board proceeded to check up bills and at 12 o'clock adjourned to meet at 2 o'clock p. m.

The board met as per adjournment with all members present. Com. Lokensgard in the chair.

Moved by Com. Anderson that the coroner's report of Orson Doe in the matter of an inquest held over the dead body of R. C. Kandler on the 10th day of January, 1913, be accepted and that the auditor be instructed to issue warrants for same. Motion seconded by Com. Sampson and carried.

Moved by Com. Sanders that the following bills be allowed and that the auditor be instructed to issue warrants for same on the proper funds. Motion seconded by Com. Sampson and carried.

Moved by Com. Sampson that the following bonds covering county general deposits be accepted:

Citizens Bank of Minot, \$5000; Northern Trust Co., for two years at 2 per cent interest.

First State Bank of Minot, \$5000; with the Dakota Trust Company as surety for the term of two years, interest at 3 per cent.

Foxholm State Bank, bond in the amount of \$5000 with the Northern Trust Company as surety for the term of two years, interest at 3 per cent.

Personal bond of the Citizens State Bank of Douglas in the amount of \$10,000 for a deposit of \$5000 with Geo. L. Robinson, Wm. H. Robinson, J. C. Robinson, J. W. Robinson, and D. P. Robinson as sureties for the term of two years, interest at 3 per cent.

Motion seconded by Com. Vandenoever and carried.
