Moved by Com. Vandenoever, seconded by Com. Sanders that Olaf Larson be appointed road overseer in Twp 152, R. 83 in place of Knut Holm, resigned, and the Auditor is hereby instructed to notify him of same. Motion carried.

Moved by Com. Anderson, seconded by Com. Vandenoever that the contract between Ward County and Lloyd Coal Co. for furnishing Ward County with coal for one year be accepted and approved and the Chairman and the Auditor authorized to sign same. Carried. Moved by Com. Huber, seconded by Com. Sanders that the application of Nichols & Shepherd for refund tax for the year 1911 on personal property in the Village of Berthold be allowed for the reason that the property assessed did not belong to said company, and the Auditor directed to issue a refunding order to Nichols & Shepherd in the sum of \$25.20. Motion carried.

No. 202 for sale of 1910 be allowed for the reason that the taxes sold were on a piece of land that was not proven up until after the date of sale, this making an illegal sale, and the Auditor authorized to issue refunding order in the sum of \$69.61.
