RIVER NOT NAVIGABLE

OLAF A. OLSON WINS THE MUCH MOOTED CASE—SAYS HE WILL LEAVE BRIDGE WHERE IT IS FOR SOME TIME.

The Supreme court has decided that the Mouse river is not a navigable stream. The decision was handed down this week in the famous Geo. A. Bissell-Olaf A. Olson case.

Olson owns considerable land west of the city limits and the river passes along the farm. He built a low foot-bridge across the river so low that it interfered with launches going up and down the stream. Geo. Bissell, owner of a launch, started an action to compel Olson to take the bridge away. This was done several years ago and the case was carried to the supreme court.

Olson states that he will probably allow the bridge to remain for some time to come.

The case was an appeal from an order of the district court of Ward county, Leighton, Judge.

Reversed. Opinion of the court by Spalding, Chief Justice.

Noble, Blood and Adamson appeared for the appellant and W. F. Doherty of Minot for the respondent.

The second section of the opinion follows:

2. To constitute a stream, which is not tide-water, navigable, it must be navigable in fact from its natural state without aid or reference to artificial means, and be of sufficient capacity to render it capable of being used as a highway of commerce either in the transportation of the products of the mines, forests or of the soil, of the country through which it runs, or of passengers.

CHILDREN DROWN


IN RAIN BARREL.
