The paper is an eight page six-column affair, filled with the liveliest kind of Elk dope and readable ads, from the local merchants. The Cabaret staff consisted of Orrin M. Pierce, Franklin Kauffman and Ira D. Wight, who declare "they are willing to go out in the alley or behind the shed with anybody at any old time they ain't busy." We understand that the editors have been in hiding however, since the issue was mailed.

ATTEMPTED TO KILL HIMSELF

THEODORE AMONSON LEAPED FROM SOUTH BRIDGE, BUT CLOTHING CAUGHT ON PROJECTION, AND HE HUNG THERE UNTIL RESCUED.

Fargo, Dec. 2.—Theodore Amonson leaped from the south bridge this morning, in an attempt to end his life. The attempt failed, for his clothing caught on a projecting pipe at the side of the bridge, about five feet below the railing, and he hung there above the water until the police were notified and removed him from his precarious position. He is lodged in a cell at the police station.
Amonson is supposed to have been temporarily insane from the effects of whiskey. He talks very coherently in his cell and admitted that he had been drinking heavily. He said he did not want to kill himself, and hardly knew why he attempted the leap.
He says he has a mother and brother in Walcott, and a sister in the state.
