Moved by Com. Huber, seconded by
Com. Sanders that the report of B. J.
Anderson, appraiser of estray stock
taken up by Frank Teets be accepted
and placed on file. Motion carried.

Moved by Com. Sanders seconded
by Com. Anderson that the warrant of
admission of E. D. Kelley, Sheriff, for
taking Ray O. Baumgardner to Jamest-
own be accepted and approved. Mo-
tion carried.

by Com. Huber that the petition for
a bridge across coulee near Sections
2-3-10 and 11, Twp. 154, R. 93, signed
by John O'Leary and others be reject-
ed. Motion carried.

ed by Com. Huber that the requisitions
from the following named officers
be accepted and the Auditor di-
rected to order the supplies. Motion
carried.

WHEREAS, upon a recent trial of
the Case of Ward County against E.
G. Warren, testimony was introduced
which shows that the question as to
what amount of money is due from
the County Superintendent of Schools
of Ward County to the County for
teachers' permits, teachers' certifi-
cates and endorsements of teachers'
certificates, renewals of teachers' cer-
tificates and monies received from
other counties for teachers' certificates
issued there to residents of Ward
County and

WHEREAS there seems to be a
question as to whether all the money
due Ward county has been paid into
the office of the County Treasurer of
Ward County by the Superintendent
of Schools.

NOW THEREFORE, the State
Bank Examiner for North Dakota is
