THREE PRISONERS ESCAPE FROM WARD CO. BASTILE

NEAL, THE NEGRO HIGHWAY-MAN, SNYDER, THE HORSE THIEF, AND BRADY, WIFE DESERTER, SAW AWAY BARS AND LET THEMSELVES TO THE GROUND WITH BLANKET.

Three of the most desperate criminals held in the Ward county jail, P. W. Brady, the wife deserter, Dan Neal, the negro convicted of highway robbery, and Albert Snyder, the boy criminal just out of the Canadian prison, charged with horse stealing, escaped from the Ward county jail Friday evening about eight-thirty o'clock, by sawing two bars of the upper story of the jail, and letting themselves to the ground twelve feet below by means of a knotted blanket, fastened to one of the firm bars. A fourth prisoner, Barrett, was caught by one of the night jailors, just as he was half way thru the window, and pulled back. He was undoubtedly an accomplice, and a moment later would have been breathing free air.

Once out, the darkness of night swallowed the men completely and at this writing the slightest clue as to their whereabouts has not been secured, altho the officers have been raking Minot and surrounding country with fine-tooth combs.

The escape of the men was learned ten minutes after they made their

carefully planned get-away. The day jailor, Ernie Thompson, had just been relieved from duty and the night jailor, Tom Cloone, had come on duty. It was while Cloone was getting ready for his night's work that the three men crawled from the small opening made by sawing two of the bars completely off and bending them outwards. It must have required some tight squeezing for the men to get through the small opening, but not one of them is very large and they managed to accomplish the feat in some manner.

The men threw several of their personal belongings out of the window, intending to pick them up when once on the ground, but in their hurry to get away did not stop to pick them up. The negro's cap and coat were under the window while the boy Snyder overlooked a sweater and his tobacco.

The prisoners must have had some help from the outside, prior to their escape. Someone must have slipped them a saw. They managed to saw away the bars when none of the jailors were around and while doing so, a blanket was stretched over the window. Neal, the negro, was a Burke county prisoner, who had been sentenced to the penitentiary for seven years for helping to hold up a youth at Portal last summer. He was being held in the Ward county jail as a witness and very soon would have been taken to Bismarck to begin his sentence. Usually, Neal was kept locked in his cell after 4 o'clock each afternoon, but on this day he was overlooked. Neal was arrested at Portal after a running fight last summer, in which he was shot thru the stomach. He was brot to Minot, placed in the hospital, where he recovered. Neal is 25 years of age, 6 feet tall, weight 150 lbs., and wore tan shoes when he escaped.

Brady, the wife deserter, is 25 years old, 5 feet 5 inches tall, and weighs 150 lbs. He has light hair, gray eyes, and a light complexion. He wore blue trousers and tan button shoes. Brady was convicted only last week of wife desertion. He would have received a long sentence in the penitentiary, no less than 5 years. His wife and three weeks' old baby are in Minot. Brady was well supplied with money, his mother having sent him \$500 to fight his case. Brady, since his imprisonment, managed to talk to his wife by phone, and he told her if he got out he would mash her head in. Mrs. Brady has been living in constant fear of her husband.

Young Snyder is 18 years old. He is 5 feet and 2 inches tall, weighs 115 pounds and has brown hair and dark gray eyes. He has one gold upper tooth and wore new tan lace shoes and brown trousers. He is a Swiss. He served time in a Canadian jail for stealing wheat, but was brot to Minot by Sheriff Kelley charged with stealing horses near Donnybrook.

Sheriff Kelley is leaving no stone unturned to get his men. Mr. Kelley and Deputies Dougherty and Hovind spent all of Friday night looking for them. Every train was watched and they could hardly have escaped this

way. All of the surrounding towns were notified and farmers throuot the country were notified by phone. It is believed that they are being secreted somewhere in Minot and the sheriff fully believes that he will eventually land them.

A reward of \$25 for each man has been offered. Sheriff Kelley has never before lost a prisoner and he does not propose to let these men get away. We'll place odds on Kelley, even if these men did get away on Friday, the thirteenth.
