VOTES FOR WOMEN COLUMN

The pet argument of the opponent of votes for women, which he uses whenever he is badgered into a corner and has no more arguments in his quiver, is: "Well, anyhow, woman's proper sphere is the home."
It is, we think, yet what institution in all the land is more threatened by bad social and economic conditions than the home? In what cause is it nobler to march to the polls than that of the home? And what of the millions of women wage workers who are denied their right to any home sphere at all because unjust economic conditions force them to labor?
The Chicago Evening Post makes an interesting point:
In the home sphere we once found the spinning wheel and the loom. The kitchen garden, the churn, the flour barrel and the baking board were part of it. The hosiery was knitted, the candles were molded, the fruit was canned, the beef was corned, by home industry.
The woman in the home had many activities and various to occupy her mind in those days. Moreover, she had direct control over most of the fabrics and foodstuffs that were used in the home. The domestic empire in which her word was law had scope and importance.
However, the unsentimental hand of business reached into the home and robbed it of one occupation after another. The spinning wheel and the loom became a part of the woolen mills and the cotton factories; the kitchen garden vanished as population concentrated in cities—the back yard and the apartment house took its place; Elgin, Illinois, capitalized the

churn and made butter for the nation; breadmaking became a matter of profit in big bakeries; holeproof hosiery was substituted for the kind that mother used to knit; gas an electric light supplied by public utility corporations took the place of candles; the products of the home kettle and pickle vat yielded the goods of the canners and packers.
The home sphere was so narrowed that little was left it but motherhood. But many a woman today protests against this narrowing, and, accepting the definition of her sphere as the home, insists that she must extend her activities in order to follow the interests of the home into the wider field whither they have been swept in the evolution of industry. And this is a field that is increasingly regulated by legislation. Hence the demand for the suffrage as one phase of the feminist movement. Simply as a mother, in order to regain control of those matters that affect her offspring and that were once under her immediate supervision, she must have access to the ballot box.
This is only one phase of the problem, but it is sufficient to show that the cry of "woman's sphere is the home" has applications vastly broader than is realized by those who are most prone to raise it.
This, we think, is well reasoned, logical and true. Moreover, we fear that the development of such implications as these will be a great shock to the criers of "woman's sphere is the home," because their outlook, unfortunately, is not wide. Theirs is the narrow vision of those who are always being shocked by the sledge-hammer blow of discovery that there are things outside the scope of the crack-like aperture through which their mind's eye peeps.

Woman's sphere is the home; but the home is so bound up with a social organization that has robbed the home of the loom, the spinning wheel, the candle mold and the churn, that woman's influence, representing and voting for the home, is needed to keep a stable and tenable social and economic balance.
Pertinent Questions.
Do you know that the Upper House of the N. D. legislature passed on Feb. 14, 1913, by vote of 31 to 19 Senate Bill No. 8, a bill providing for woman's suffrage?
Do you know that the Lower House of the North Dakota legislature passed on March 7th, by vote of 77 to 29, the same bill providing for woman's suffrage?
Do you know that the Governor of N. D. signed the bill providing for woman's suffrage on March 7th, 1913?
Do you know that this bill will be voted on by the male citizens of N. D. at the fall election, Nov. 3, 1914, and must receive a majority of all the votes cast to become a law, and if carried that North Dakota women may vote after this election?
Do you know that to pass with majority of votes means it must be the biggest question voted on? Will you help to make the majority?
