

Neelands at Bottineau nine years ago  
and six years ago Mr. and Mrs. Neelands

since resided. Mrs. Neelands was born  
in Indiana and came to North Dakota  
with her parents 25 years ago. For  
a time she resided in Grand Forks.

Besides her husband, Mrs. Neelands  
is survived by a brother, J. M. Cooper  
of Finley, N. D., and two sisters, Mrs.  
Allen of Finley and Mrs. F. S. Atkin-  
son, of Purcell, N. D.

position and made friends readily,  
hundreds of whom sincerely mourn.
