Equity Exchange Case Being Tried.

The case of the state vs. the Equity Co-operative Exchange, started at Fargo Tuesday before Judge Pollock, with Attorney General Linde and his assistant, Francis J. Murphy, prosecuting.

An effort will be made to annul the Exchange's charter in the state and to prevent that organization from soliciting any more stock or from doing any more business in the state. Irregularities are charged against Geo. S. Loftus, the manager, and several of the other officers and directors of the Exchange.

A large crowd gathered at Fargo to be present at the trial which will be fought bitterly.

Senator Bond Back From Canada.

Senator Walter Bond returned from a business trip to Edmonton Sunday morning. Mrs. Bond accompanied him to Calgary, where she is visiting with relatives. She called on Mrs. M. H. Mills, formerly of this city, who will soon visit friends in Minot enroute to her old home in Iowa, where she will make her home.

Mr. Bond says 10,000 soldiers are quartered in Calgary and 2,000 at Edmonton, waiting anxiously for a call to the front. They are called out a few hundred at a time to fill in the gaps left by those who have been shot down.

Sons of Norway Assn. Organized.

The Sons of Norway Building Association of Minot, has been organized with a capital stock of \$20,000. The incorporators are John J. Lee, O. P. Nustad, John K. Sveen and R. A. Nestos. The organization proposes to buy a site and erect a brick block soon.

Another Bank for Towner.

The Pioneer State Bank of Towner has been incorporated with a capital stock of \$10,000. Incorporators, H. H. Thompson, Ella Thompson, both of Towner, and F. G. Bullock, of Denbigh.

Scofield Has 2500 Acres Seeded.

James Scofield has 2500 acres seeded to date at his big farm south of Minot. He is putting in 250 acres of corn this year and will fill two large silos. Mr. Scofield is one of our biggest farmers, but at the same time, he diversifies to a great extent, feeding hundreds of head of hogs and cattle annually. He recently disposed of some of the finest corn fed cattle to local butchers that were ever produced in this section of the state.

Hurley Babe Died.

The seven-months-old babe of Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Hurley, who occupy the Mrs. Underdahl farm near Drady, died Sunday. The remains were interred at the cemetery north of Surrey Tuesday afternoon, where services were held. Mr. and Mrs. Hurley have the sympathy of many friends.

Spring Water for Minot.

The City Commission is working on a plan to furnish Minot with pure spring water. City Engineer Thomas estimates that the city needs a supply of 1,000,000 gallons every 24 hours and an expert will soon investigate the springs in northwestern Minot with a view to sinking test wells.

Twine Agents Getting Busy.

The Independent learns that agents for twine are going thru the country telling the farmers that there will be a shortage of twine this year, and advising them to place their orders with the agents in order to get in at the right price. Farmers can afford to investigate before placing their orders. Local dealers guarantee that they will have plenty of twine on hand and believe that the price will be a little lower than last year.

ARREST MINOT WOMAN ON CHARGE OF WHITE SLAVERY.

Fargo, May 15.—May for some months past a traveler in a number of states, was arraigned before Judge Amidon yesterday to answer to the charge of being a white slaver. The indictment against her was found by the October federal grand jury and has been pending while the government officials trailed her through Missouri, Arkansas, Kansas and other states until she was finally arrested in Des Moines. She is bound over in the sum of \$2,000.

It is said that this is not a blackmail case or anything of that order but the officers consider the woman guilty of the persistent practice against which the Mann law was devised. She is an attractive appearing woman about 24 years of age.
