### ADJOURNED MEETING OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.

Nov. 26th, 1915.  
The Board of County Commissioners of Ward County, North Dakota, met at 2 o'clock P. M., Nov. 26th, 1915, in the office of the county auditor as per adjournment. Com. Anderson in the chair. Members present, Lokensgard, Rohe, Hennessy, Vandenoever.

This being the date set for receiving bids for graveling roads and there being no bids submitted, on motion of Com. Lokensgard seconded by Com. Rohe, the board proceeded to allow bills. Moved by Com. Lokensgard, seconded by Com. Hennessy that the following resolution be adopted. Motion carried.

Whereas the bridge across Mouse River near Logan is in need of repairs,

Be it therefore resolved, that the auditor be and he is hereby instructed to advertise for bids for the necessary repairs for said bridge. Bids to be received up to the hour of two o'clock P. M., December 10th, 1915.

Moved by Com. Vandenoever, seconded by Com. Lokensgard, that the requisition from the Clerk of the District Court for 75 names to complete the juror list be accepted and the names distributed among the various townships, villages and cities. Motion carried.

Motion carried.

The Board met at 9 o'clock A. M. as per adjournment. Com. Anderson in the chair with all members present.

Moved by Com. Hennessy, seconded by Com. Lokensgard that the following applications for abatement of

taxes be accepted and auditor instructed to make the necessary corrections on the tax lists. Motion carried.

Application of Lawrence Bunney for abatement of penalty and interest on 1913 personal property taxes in Maryland township, there being an error in writing up tax list, Mr. Bunney not being notified of the assessment.

Application of M. Schoenwold for abatement of 1914 personal property taxes in Iota Flat township, for the reason of double assessment.

Application of First Congregational church for abatement of 1914 real estate taxes on Lot 1, Ehr's Add. to Minot, this property being church property and exempt from taxation.

Moved by Com. Rohe, seconded by Com. Vandenoever, that the application of Henry Zosel for abatement of 1914 real estate taxes on the SW 1-4 SW 1-4, Sec. 26, Twp. 151-84, be rejected for the reason that this board has no power to equalize taxes at this time. Motion carried.

Mrs. Hanson appeared before the board in regard to getting her taxes abated and the matter was referred to Com. Vandenoever to take up with the city commissioners.
