There is an especial demand for cable, telegraph and wireless operators, inside and outside wiremen, electricians, machinists, photographers and men trained

The officer is Major Henry G. Opdycke, a veteran of the Spanish-American war, who has charge of the recruiting in New York city and vicinity.

The quintet were driving in a big touring car owned by Nels Iverson, Mohall banker, when Iverson attempted to steer the car out of the way of a car which was coming out of the park. The Iverson car ran off the grade and toppled over the grade pinning the occupants under it. Ollie Syer-son dislocated his shoulder and Nels Iverson, Hubert Johnson and Will Harding were severely bruised. The deceased is survived by a wife and one son.


Colored Fellow Sold Beer to Finwall

KILLED IS QUARREL AT KARLSRUHE

William Gefroh Meets Death in Early Morning Quarrel with Martin Dillman

Karlsruhe, a little village on the Surrey line of the Great Northern about 30 miles southeast of Minot, was the scene of a tragedy on the morning of June 26th, when William Gefroh, a young farmer living south of town, was shot and killed by Martin Dillman.

The tragedy was the result of a quarrel between the men. Gefroh and a party of friends had come to the Dillman home about midnight from the Schwab-Senger wedding and at 2:30 Tuesday morning was ordered from the house after a quarrel. He returned later accompanied by his brother, Anton, when the quarrel was renewed. Dillman procured a shot gun and went out into the yard and as Gefroh came in sight from behind an automobile he was shot in the leg just below the body. The main artery was severed and he died in a few
