





BRIEF STATE NEWS

The Federal government promises to reopen the Indian school at Bismarck.
 Editor Stratton, of the Wing Statesman, has been called to Cleveland, O., brother.
 A burglar entered Geo. Bilski's clothing store at Mandan and got away with \$76 in cash.
 Having proved so helpful to the farmers through wheat shocking, Two trainment were killed in a wreck near Jamestown caused by the 6-45 inches of rain that fell last Monday.
 thousands of residents of North Dakota towns and villages are now planning to still further boost the community spirit by helping through threshing.
 Glenn E. Trobridge, of Williston, was killed in action in northern France. He was 32 years old and had been a soldier for just a year.
 Editor Wardell of the Pembina Pioneer Express, dean of the North Dakota editors, has permanently abandoned the game and will locate in California.
 Dr. E. J. Houser, a Dickinson dentist, who was convicted of killing a prairie chicken out of season, probably wanted to pull the bird's teeth.
 Sergt. R. P. Morris, a veteran of the Indian and Civil wars, passed away at his home in New Rockford, at the advanced age of 90 years.
 Pat Needham, an N. P. engineer out of Dickinson, has run a locomotive for years without getting off the tracks. He tried to engineer a Henry and went off the grade into a ditch on his first run.
 Otto Wahnchaffee, a switchman in the Great Northern yards at Devils Lake, was run over by a train and instantly killed. He is survived by a

wife and two children.

Editor Doherty, of the Dunn County Settler, says the report that Editor Peterson had enlisted in the "tank" service of the army is false.

Williston is to have a service flag. It will contain between three and four hundred stars. Every community should have a service flag—if it is entitled to one.

C. J. Lund, a Cass county farmer near Fargo, is reported to have threshed wheat that yielded fifty-six bushels per acre and weighed sixty-two pounds to the bushel.

Dr. J. P. Ayleen of Fargo, now a major in the American medical service, will soon be joined by Dr. W. C. Ayleen of Mandan, his son, who has recently been commissioned.

Melbert Bryant of Dickinson, committed to the state institution for feeble minded from the hospital at Jamestown, was killed by a bull at the institution.

O. W. Roberts, Burleigh county food administrator, has seized 3,000 bushels of stored wheat near Williston and will sell it for the Red Cross. Part of it has been held since 1916.

Ned Bunanko, of Dognen, has been interned for the period of the war. He stated in his questionnaire that he would not fight the kaiser, nor did he desire to become a citizen of the United States.

The seven-year-old daughter of Elmer Harvey sustained a broken collar bone when a car loaded with relatives went over and over down an 80-foot embankment north of Burt. The car is a total wreck but the occupants had only minor bruises.

J. F. Field, agent for the Rogers Lumber Co., at Manfred, was arrested for embezzlement. It is alleged that Field forged the names of prominent farmers to notes aggregating more than \$6,000.

Despite the claim that children consume more sweets than grown-ups, the food administration in North Dakota refuses to permit purchasers to include children under 4 in the sugar allowance.

The Braddock News says that the correct name of Enmons county's famous summer resort is "Pershing Lake," instead of "Persian Lake," as it is generally known. That's better—even though it wasn't named for Gen. Jack Pershing.

Frank Klingenstein, aged 18, was struck by lightning at his home at Youngstown during last week's big electrical storm and instantly killed. The young man, with two brothers, was in the barn, doing the evening's chores when the bolt struck. His brothers were both badly burned.

The inevitable has come to Co. K, one of the first fighting units to enter the front lines trenches in France. Peter Lish, the 22-year-old son of Postmaster and Mrs. Frank Lish of Dickinson, was killed in action in the Soissons-Chateau-Thierry battle on August 20th. Only a few days before his death he captured a big six-foot Hun and sent him to the rear to a prison pen. One of the officers, in speaking of the lad's work, declared he feared nothing and got more than his share of the Germans before they got him.

North Dakota will have to have more prisoners in the state peniten-

ary or close the twine factory. There are only 100 men in prison, compared with a population of over two years ago. By January 1, next, the number will be reduced to ninety-one, and only one hundred fourteen are crimped and

unable to perform any work. As a means of keeping the twine plant running, Warden Talcott announced the state is negotiating with the Federal government for the transfer of Federal prisoners to the state penitentiary. Until the question of a sufficient number of men in the institution to board of control will not contract for sisal.


