



HAIL LOSSES HEAVY.
\$1,512,000 Paid on Claims in North Dakota Against Premiums of \$436,000.
Chicago, Nov. 21.—Heavy insurance losses sustained by the Western Hail association in North Dakota and Montana were made public today following the annual meeting of the association here. Increases in rates in those states were found necessary. In the district of North Dakota in which a 7-1-2 per cent rate is charged, the premiums were \$436,000 and the losses paid \$1,512,000. In Montana also it was reported the losses were larger than the premiums in spite of a 10 per cent rate.
"WAR BABY" LEFT IN TRAIN COACH.
Red Wing, Minn., Nov. 23.—A baby boy, about two months old, was found by W. W. Conley, conductor on the Olympian, the Milwaukee road coast train, tonight. A note reading "this is a war baby; born in North Dakota" was attached to the clothing of the infant. The note also asked that the baby be well taken care of. It was sent to the St. John's hospital. The mother, it is said, started from St. Paul and got off the train at Hastings, leaving the baby on the train.
