

FARMERS BANK PREPARING NEW LOCATION

Robert P. Stacy-Judd Takes Entire Charge of Remodeling Building—Work Costing \$15,000 to Start at Once.

Friday night the board of directors of the First Farmers bank of Minot unanimously decided to commence alterations and additions to their new location in the Colcord building leased for ten years, on Central avenue. The directors further decided to leave the entire works in the hands of their architect, Robt. B. Stacy-Judd of Minot, to purchase all materials and have charge of all labor.

In an interview with G. S. Youmans, president of the bank it was learned the work in making alterations and improvements for the bank's new location will be commenced immediately. It is hoped that the bank can be moved to its new location by the first of March, or soon thereafter.

The entire main floor of the building, size 40x100 feet, is to be used exclusively for the home offices of the Savings and Loan and Trust company and for the banking quarters of the First Farmers bank of Minot. These institutions are affiliated with the American Exchange bank of Watford City and the First Security bank of Carpio. All four enterprises are owned by several hundred farmers.

As planned and when completed, upon entering the building you will find to the right the officers' quarters and behind this section two private rooms are provided for the convenience of the officers and customers. Situated along the west wall at the rear of the working space of about 38 feet extending to the bank fixtures to the left, will be located the largest vault in this part of the country. It was decided to erect one of such dimensions, owing to the rapid increase of business of these progressive institutions. The interior dimensions of the vault are to be 10x17 feet. The vault will be constructed of re-inforced concrete throughout and to rear will be a safety deposit vault section with private customers' room additional.

To the rear of the public lobby will be the president's room, dimensions 10x14 feet, with stenographer's room in connection and access to the customers' room, directors' room, working space for clerks and public lobby. The directors' room is 11x14 feet and the clerks' room to the right is the same size with a large store room leading from same. Private and public toilets are provided on the banking floor and also private rooms for officers and customers are to be provided to the rear of the officers' rooms. A new ventilating and additional heating system is to be installed and the electric lighting scheme is well thought out. A system of inter-telephone communication will be installed and buzzer system to all working points to reduce undue labor throughout. A decorative scheme of plain but tasteful coloring for the ceiling, walls, and fixtures will result in a harmony of unusual degree.

The banking fixtures are to be entirely remodeled and additional fixtures installed. In the public lobby a staircase will lead to the beautiful rest room quarters in the basement reserved for the sole use of the customers of the bank. An assembly hall with platform and private rooms behind same with ladies' and gentlemen's toilet accommodation is to be provided.

The officers and directors of the First Farmers bank of Minot in launching their plans for a new and better banking location have taken the initiation among the citizens of Minot for the building year of 1919.
