



Jess Willard, who held the heavy-weight championship of the world for a number of years, was knocked out in the third round at Toledo, O., on the 23rd. Willard is 34 years of age and weighs 250 pounds, while Dempsey is 24 years old and tips the scales at 200. Willard was knocked down seven times during the first round, as is proved by the moving pictures of the fight and from that time on he was practically out of the contest. One of Willard's eyes was pretty badly used up but he was in about a good shape as ever a day or two after the fight. He was motored to his home at Lawrence, Kansas, accompanied by his wife. Willard has salted away something like half a million dollars since he became world champion and while it must be humiliating for a big fellow to take such a beating, there's many a man who would be willing to take as much punishment for a good deal less.

SOLDIERS SHOULD MAKE APPLICATION FOR STATE MONEY

Under the provisions of a law passed by the recent Legislature, every honorably discharged soldier or sailor, a resident of North Dakota, is entitled to make application for the sum of \$25 for each month or fractional part of a month he was with the colors. The first blank is one giving the full military history of the soldier and can be had free by applying to the Adjutant General, Bismarck, N. D. Every soldier and sailor is urged to write for this form and one will be promptly sent from Bismarck. The value of completing this service record cannot now be estimated. As time goes on, more and more questions will arise over the service record of each soldier. By filing this record in Bismarck (and for all services concerned there is no charge) any question that arises in the future, such as allotments, insurance, bonds purchased, travel pay, disability claims, etc., can be properly investigated from the vital service questions already on file. By securing and filing this Military Service Record, you will be doing yourself a favor and one that you will better appreciate years from now.
