

### CATTLE DIE FROM DRINKING POISONED WATER

City of Minot Must Do Something With Sewage at Once—Talk of \$300,000 Suit—Stench Below City is Unbearable.

A delegation of farmers, consisting of Peter Holbach, Edward Nelson and Chas. Larson from down the river, met with the city commission Monday night and urged that the board take immediate action concerning the deplorable condition of Mouse river, below the city by reason of the sluggishness of the stream and the foul properties thrown continually into the stream from Minot's sewers.

The farmers explained that the cattle are dying from drinking the poisoned water, which is covered with a greenish, poisonous substance. Chas. Larson lost four head of cattle and Tillman Saugstad lost seven head, one cow being worth \$150.00. The river has such a terrible stench that the people who reside along the stream cannot sleep. The fish are dying by the countless thousands and wild ducks are found dead along the banks. The cows drink the water when they are compelled to do so, and the milk is sold in Minot. It is a wonder that a typhoid fever epidemic has not broken out. Farmers say that they cannot dispose of their land should they desire to do so, and they threaten to bring a suit for approximately \$300,000 damages against the city. The farmers have been very patient, but all agree that they have a good sized kick coming. The river is in a horrible condition all the way from Minot to Sawyer, fifteen miles below the city.

Mr. Nelson says that he lives five miles down the river, but the river must wind in and out for a distance of fifteen miles before it gets to his place.

The city commission appear very favorable to doing what it can to eliminate this trouble, each member expressing himself as being desirous to do all that is in his power. President Shaw thanked the farmers for appearing before the board and promising that he would call a special session of the board just as soon as City Attorney Woolage returns.

President Long of the Association of Commerce and the Rotary Club, President Jones of the Town Criers Club and F. B. Lambert, member of the Park Board, spoke in favor of taking immediate action, the clubs having already passed resolutions favoring the building of a modern septic tank to eliminate this trouble, which is becoming more unbearable each year as the city grows.

President Shaw explained that it would probably cost \$250,000 to build such a plant and that it could not be done without the voters of Minot passing favorably on the bonds. An election will undoubtedly be called and it is believed that when the people of Minot realize how badly the plant is needed, there is no question but what the bond issue will carry.

The farmers were urged to take the matter up with the state board of health.

It is not likely that any relief can be offered this year but the farmers will be satisfied if immediate action is taken, in hopes that they will not have to put up with the menace next year.

Mr. Lambert explained that the park board had built a beautiful drive around Elbow Park but that it could not be used on account of the stench. People living in the eastern part of the city complain on account of the smell whenever the wind is from the east.
