CAR STOLEN THREE TIMES IS RECOVERED
 Four Men Placed Under Arrest in Connection With the Theft of Granville Ford Auto.

It appears that there has been a gang connected with the theft of several cars in this vicinity and a couple of members of the gang tried to get the cars away from the others. Worms are Killing Grasshoppers.
 L. L. Logan, who has been investigating the grasshopper situation northeast of the city, has discovered by making a thoro examination that countless thousands of grasshoppers are dying from the effects of worms which have imbedded themselves in the body of the grasshoppers beneath the wings. Out of a thousand grass-

hoppers examined, Mr. Logan found worms in all but a few of them and out of that number, he found that but five carried eggs. He believes that the worms are the result of the little red insects that were noticed under the wings earlier in the season.

The farmers in this vicinity are fortunate that they have an abundance of feed. While the crops were not heavy, there is an abundance of good straw which will help out the feed question in good shape. The hay crop was fair and those who grew corn report the best yield in years. There are some sections of the state that were not so fortunate.
