LANGER SAYS MISS NIELSON HAS POWER TO NAME COURSE
Campaign speeches of A. C. Townley, Governor Frazier and other Non-partisan league leaders are cited by Attorney General William Langer in an opinion handed down recently, in which he holds that Miss Minnie Nielson, state superintendent of public instruction, and not the newly formed board of administration, has the power to name the courses of study in North Dakota's public schools.

The opinion was handed down by the attorney general in answer to a request from Charles Lesman, secretary of the administration board, asking for a ruling as to the preparation of courses of study in the state public schools.

Quotes Speeches.
In stating his view that Miss Nielson has control over the courses of study, Mr. Langer, after quoting from the campaign speeches of Mr. Townley and Governor Frazier in which they defended the administration law, and denied that it would take away any power from Miss Nielson, says:
"Only men with almost utter absence of self respect would maintain for an instant that words in the law enacted meant different than the same words in the same law after the farmers enacted it by their vote. To do so would mean that those responsible would be guilty of the blackest treachery towards the farmers, guilty of desperate misrepresentation, and would place a premium on deceit and broken promises."

NEW WAY TO BUY BANK.
The Bank of North Dakota officials co-operating with the Industrial Commission taught the public a new wrinkle in the way to buy a bank. The Bank of North Dakota was provided for by law and as we understood they were expected to sell \$2,000,000 of bonds to the public as the basis for the bank. This was tried but they could only sell \$300,000 of the bonds and began business and issued calls for deposit of public monies. When there was plenty of money in sight they drew from these funds and bought bonds of the Industrial Commission for the necessary amount and had them re-deposited and the trick was turned. If individuals could only start banks in that way we could have a nice bank in every township. All that would be necessary would be to get a building by lease, call in some funds as deposits, and then use that to put up for capital stock and the whole thing could be done without any fuss or worry to anyone.—Cavalier County Republican.

TO PROHIBIT HUGGING.
Duluth, Minn., Aug. 16.—Chief of Police John Murphy will submit to the city council an amendment to the traffic ordinance, which will prohibit a man from driving an automobile with one hand while he entwines the other about the person of his lady friend, sitting next to him.

The case will also hold true when the young lady is driving and holding her gentleman friend in the car with the other arm.

"Automobile speeding at 30 miles an hour has to stop," declared Murphy. "There is too much of it. If a man wants to hug his girl he will have to shut off the engine."

BET \$10,000 ON HIS GIRL.
Dickinson, N. D., Aug. 16.—Peter Berringer, wealthy car dealer and manager of the local Ford service station, has put up a wager of \$10,000 on his daughter's car-driving ability. Mr. Berringer believes that Miss Hazel can drive a Ford car from Dickinson to New York in 96 hours, or in six days of 16 hours each, the time to be counted only when the car is moving.

It is not known whether Mr. Berringer's faith is in Hazel or in Lizzie, but it is certain that he means business, and anyone with \$10,000 and good grit can either lose or win a fortune in a week.
