The annual Indian fair is being held at Elbowoods this week.

Two little children are dead from diphtheria at Dickinson.

John C. Meany, former Glenburn homesteader, died at Casslon, N. D.

Van Hook farmers received over \$4,000 for cream during the month of August.

Jim Hayes and Mr. Moffat have 140 acres of fine alfalfa at the Moffat farm near Granville.

Lightning struck the Arne Krogen residence in Parshall, damaging the chimney and tearing a hole in the roof.

Rufus Tree sold to Fred Robinson what is known as the Jim Marlenee half section farm south of Velva for \$47 an acre.

Henry Ford announces a cut of \$142 on his automobiles. Henry is always doing something to get himself talked about.

Louis Harrison, who was employed on the old Kenmare Journal during the early days, died last week at Billings, Mont.

The editor of the Van Hook Tribune hears that some hunters are hunting prairie chickens with dogs contrary to law.

The Velva school board has leased the Hauges church for a class room for teaching music. The Velva schools are over crowded.

A state veterinarian condemned a number of pure bred cattle owned by Otto Nothnagel of Tatman township. The cows had tuberculosis.

Mrs. A. G. Erickson, aged 45 years, passed away at her home four miles east of Plaza. She is survived by her husband and five children.

Harry Patten, a Parshall farmer, struck a fork handle when he slid from a load of grain. A Parshall surgeon is attending him and states he will recover.

Peter Heuer, a Parshall farmer, suffered a painful injury to his nose while coupling a heavily loaded grain wagon to a tractor. He is under the care of a doctor.

Dave Armstrong of Willow City, lost four of his finest sheep by turning them from his pasture into his alfalfa field. Although they were turned in but an hour, he lost four in spite of all he could do.

A young transient stole a gold watch from Mrs. Burgess at the Wm. Burgess farm near Ruso and also took a revolver and a razor. He went to Velva but hurriedly leaving a coat in which the razor was found.

A Scotchman giving Wm. Wallace as his name, was arrested near Sherwood for insanity. He had taken every stitch of clothing off and then lay down for a sleep in a field near the town. He was turned over to

the Canadian authorities by Sheriff Geo. Scofield. He is the same fellow who gave an open air concert at Glenburn recently.

Jim Crain, prominent Granville farmer, narrowly escaped injury when he ran his car into the rear of a wagon of grain. Crain had been long without sleep and was enjoying a little nap at the wheel when the accident occurred.

Miss Ina Padget of Van Hook was severely cut about the face when she was thrown thru a wind shield when two autos collided. Cars belonging to Andy Reisch and Mail Carrier Blakeley were running at night without lights when the accident occurred.

W. I. Barnes, a Velva deputy game warden has a list of 25 Velva hunters who are scheduled for arrest for hunting before sunrise on the opening day. Several of the hunters declare they did not fire a shot until after nine o'clock, still they are on Mr. Barnes' list.
