GROWERS OF SWEET CLOVER ORGANIZE

Agricultural College, N. D.—"Sweet clover on every farm in North Dakota," is the motto of the Red River Valley Sweet Clover Seed Growers' Exchange, organized at a recent meeting held at Grand Forks.

Although the organization is less than a month old, it already controls more than half of the sweet clover seed crop in North Dakota and the growers that have signed up have agreed to market their crop thru this cooperative exchange exclusively for the next three years.

One of the big projects of the exchange will be to conduct an educational campaign on the value of sweet clover and to develop new markets for the seed. Plans are already being made for a campaign this winter to interest the farmers of western North Dakota in the crop, which is new in that territory. The belief is that the sweet clover will prove of great value in the lighter soils where drouth and soil drifting are two of the great problems, where the natural soil fertility is in need of replenishment, and where feed is difficult to secure.

Some idea of the extent of this cooperative movement can be gained from the report of the secretary, D. B. Morris of Grand Forks, whose record shows that 85 per cent of the sweet clover growers of Grand Forks county have joined the organization. Grand Forks county produces more than half of the seed crop of North Dakota, and this state produces about half of the seed crop of the United States.

Every effort will be made to increase the acreage in North Dakota and it is planned to keep as much of the seed as possible in this state.
