Mrs. Hage was possessed with a most kindly disposition and during the long months of suffering from tuberculosis she was ever patient and bore her suffering uncomplainingly. In the home which has been saddened by the hand of death is the bereaved husband, two small sons, and a daughter.

**RENVILLE COUNTY WANTS AGRICULTURAL AGENT**

Agricultural College, N. D., Nov. 9.—As the result of a very successful grasshopper eradication campaign in Renville county this year, residents of the county have become interested in county agent work and a number of meetings have been held during the past few weeks at which the proposition of securing a county agent has been discussed. Petitions are being circulated asking the county board to hire such an agent and promising the cooperation of the signers in organizing a county farm bureau. The law requires that the county commissioners hire such an agent if petitions are presented bearing signatures of 25 percent of the tax payers of the county. The county may secure approximately \$1200 of State and Federal funds annually to care for part of the expense of this work.
