

**MONEY IS "FROZEN" ALSO IN INDIANA**

Kingsbury, Ind., June 24.—The weather here of late has been most extremely hot, the corn and other grains suffering considerable, especially on the higher land, where the water level is considerable lower, the land here where I am located is all new land as it was once a perpetual swamp, having been drained for about ten years, so I naturally have a good

layout, and the land is much better than that which has been under the plow for the last sixty years and farmed by an unintelligent class of ruralists, which comprise the greatest number of the eastern farmers, as the most of them still do as their father and grandfather did before them and a great many still use the same tools, and as a result they are rewarded accordingly. The farm here where I am located comprises about five hundred acres.

It is all tillable but about thirty acres which is in a grove for a windbreak around the buildings, balance is well tilled, there being 18 miles of tile on the place.

Harvest will soon be at hand, wheat here on the lowland will make 25 bu. to the acre and oats about sixty bu. Corn is about knee high and looking fine.

Hired help ranges all the way from \$150 a year to \$35 a month, all depending upon the mentality and skill of the worker. There is a surplus of farm help everywhere due to the factories turning off all surplus help, but the most of them are inexperienced and wouldn't work if they were. So that is the labor situation here.

I might add in addition that if any of my old N. D. friends happen up this way to stop and look us up, as the river is only a half mile away and the bass and pickerel are biting, and then, too, I have about an acre of nice water-melons.

The great draw-back here is the climate, when I go to bed at night and try to pretend to sleep in spite of the heat, I think of the nights in good old North Dakota when I was always short of covers.

Well, I hope everyone has a good crop this year, and that you people dispose of your state bonds. Money has been as tight or worse than in North Dakota here. Many fellows worth \$100,000 couldn't get a dollar. So you see it wasn't all political conditions, and I want to say in addition that taxes here are as high as three and four dollars to the acre, and that you people must not junk the N. P. League for the Farmers Bureau, as it is a self-evident fact that it is as worthless from a financial viewpoint or from any other viewpoint as they have accomplished nothing in this state so far nor will they as the men at the head of it are too afraid they will injure the feelings of the big business man, and the large manufacturer. So consequently the farmer is being robbed here worse than in North Dakota because the merchant knows he can get away with it.

**JOHN BEVERLY OV VELVA DIED IN MEXICO**

Velva Journal: Friends in this city were advised this week of the death of John G. Byerly at Navojoa, Mexico, on June 11th, after a short illness of typhoid fever. His brothers, Frank A. and C. A. Byerly are in the automobile business there. John left Velva about two years ago and farmed in Montana, later going west. The news of his death came in letters from Frank Byerly to the Masonic and Odd Fellows lodges of this city of which the deceased was a member. Funeral services were held in Navojoa and he was buried there. In his letter Frank says he and his brother will care for the children of the deceased and asked the lodges here to adjust his brother's business affairs here, collect life insurance due and keep the fund in trust for the children.

In his letter to the Masonic lodge Frank says: "There is only one other Mason here besides ourselves, and it is impossible to give him a Masonic burial, but he wears the apron which he brought with him, and which the writer helped put on him when he finished his degrees in Velva."

John Byerly was about 30 years old and for a number of years resided in this community. His wife died a few years ago, leaving two small children. He was an industrious young man and well thought of by the people of this community. The news of his death is received with sincere regret.

**SOCIALIST DRAWS EGGS AT MANDAN**

Mandan, N. D., June 24.—A. B. Nelson, Portland, Ore., brought to Mandan in an auto by a Bismarck physician and E. E. Rimbach, state purchasing agent of the board of administration, last night assailed capital and labor alike in a socialistic address. Capital and labor, businessmen and workingmen, independents, service men and union labor forces then united in an egg-throwing contest at the speaker which eventually wound up with the car speaking platform being wheeled about and headed back to Bismarck.

Local Northern Pacific shopmen, many of whom have been aligned with the Nonpartisan league, aided in starting the socialist radical back towards Bismarck. "You simp laboring men" and "you are not good Americans but dirty skunks" were statements which roused all political factions in this city.

More than 1,000 people jeered the speaker, and cheered when his automobile was hustled out of the city. Rimbach, positively identified as having been in the car with the speaker, this morning denied being there. He is a socialist and was imported from Wisconsin by the Nonpartisan league to do the buying of supplies for the state capitol and the institution of the state.

**SECT VOICES OPPOSITION**

Mandan, N. D., June 24.—Twelve hundred members of the Seventh Day Adventist denomination of North Dakota in convention camp meeting here yesterday morning, adopted a resolution memorializing congress to oppose passage of any pending bills or legislation that will revive any of the Sunday blue laws, "contrary to the genius of the American system of government, in violation of American principles of separation of church and government," and referred to them as "un-American, un-Christian, unconstitutional, partial and class legislation, let America be the cradle of liberty for men of all religion or no religion" the resolution read. The unanimous action of the convention was taken this morning following an address last night by Rev. G. B. Thompson of Washington, D. C.
