BIG PRIZES TO BE GIVEN AT SHRINE CIRCUS

Automobile, Piano and Other Articles Of Value to be Awarded to Those Attending the Show

Kem Temple, A. A. O. N. M. S. is offering six big prizes for its Harvest Circus, which will be held in Grand Forks from September 19 to 24. The prizes are being given for the general public, whether they are Shriners or not, and the prizes are offered to the general public, whether Shriners or not. The prizes may be won by people who never have seen a Shrine parade, and one or more of them may come to Minot.

The chief prize is a Studebaker special six touring car with a beautiful California winter top. Kem Temple made arrangements early last spring for this car as his big capital prize. It will be given away on the closing night of the circus. The other prizes include a beautiful player piano, a Brunswick cabinet phonograph, a Sanico all white porcelain finish gas range, an electric washing machine, a Karpen parlor suite, consisting of davenport and chairs to match, and a one hundred dollar savings account. A capital prize will be given away on each night of the circus.

Officers of Kem Temple have made elaborate preparations for the circus. G. R. Jacobi, director-general, has booked a number of big circus acts, several of which have been with Ringling Brothers and Barnum and Bailey circuses. There will be five hilarious clown acts—the funniest clown acts in America, the director-general says. There will also be several acts of unusual beauty and grace—acts which would be worthy of any vaudeville stage. Of course, there will be the grand opening entry—the glittering, gorgeous array of color and beauty, such an opening parade as every small boy and girl loves.

There will be many things in addition to entertain and amuse. The Pike will be rich in side attractions, and those who visit the circus should not fail to go down the Pike, for there they will find much fun. There also will be a tea-room, where you can take your wife or your sweetheart and feed her till she cries "enough."

It will be a big week in Grand Forks and many people from Minot will help make it so.

HIGHER INTEREST RATE WILL BE FIXED ON STATE BONDS

Bismarck, N. D. Sept. 8—The industrial commission is preparing to issue to purchasers of 5 per cent mill and elevator bonds new bonds bearing 6 per cent interest. The old bonds are being called in.

The action is to be taken because the mill and elevator bonds which the industrial commission is trying to sell in its campaign are being issued at 6 per cent, it having been found necessary to increase the interest rate to make the bonds more saleable.

When the industrial commission embarked on its first bond selling campaign to obtain money to build mills and elevators it executed a mortgage on the Drake mill and property to be acquired in the future for \$5,000,000. A total of \$120,300 bonds at 5 per cent were executed and delivered. About \$25,100 worth of bonds were sold at Drake and about \$95,200 additional at Grand Forks and other places. A new mortgage, including the Grand Forks elevator, is to be filed.

BILLS, LONG PAST DUE, BEING PAID BY STATE

Bismarck, N. D. Sept. 8—A great amount of bills of various state institutions for June now are being paid by the state auditor and state treasurer.

About \$101,000 worth of warrants were paid yesterday, the warrants being chiefly for institutional expenses for early summer months. Because of the difficulty of the Bank of North Dakota in paying state bills the auditor has held up the issuance of warrants.

Among the bills paid yesterday was the payroll of the state feeble-minded institution amounting to \$3,364.94.

MINISTERS CAR STOLEN

Williston, N. D. Sept. 7—Rev. J. Prince Beasom, pastor of the English Lutheran churches of this city and Springbrook, had his touring car stolen last week. Without it he is greatly handicapped in carrying forward the work of his two congregations. Several cars have been stolen at various points in Williams county within the last few weeks, and an organized band of car thieves is generally believed to be working.

FILM THIEF SENTENCED

Minor, N. D., Sept. 8—A man giving his name as Friedman, who was arrested upon investigation following his attempt to sell a six-reel film to a Minor motion picture operator, was arraigned at Forman on a petty larceny charge. He pleaded guilty, investigation having shown that the film had been taken from a consignment in charge of the express company at Olivia, Minn. He was fined \$37.70.

MANY BEULAH ACCIDENTS

Beulah, N. D.—The 10-year-old son of John Schultz lost a finger as the result of poking it into a running corn binder. Herbert Bohrer, Manu-haven, lost a finger which was crushed by an elevator cup. Theo. Car-rigan had his leg broken when it was run over by a wagon. All the accidents happened in one day.
