

REGULAR MEETING BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Ward County, N. D., July 5, 1922. The Board of Commissioners of Ward County, North Dakota, met at the County Court House in the City of Minot, in regular session, at 2 o'clock P. M., at which the following members present: Commissioners Vandenoever, Tofner, Spicer, Haldi and Krantz, with Commissioner Krantz in the chair.

Moved by Com. Haldi, seconded by Com. Tofner that the Board of County Commissioners adjourn to meet as a Board of Equalization.

Motion carried. The Board met as a Board of Equalization, the Board being informed by the County Auditor that the assessors' books were not fully completed for such equalization and were being completed by the Board of Equalization.

Motion carried. Moved by Com. Vandenoever, seconded by Com. Haldi that the board proceed to audit bills.

Motion carried. The Board spent the afternoon auditing bills. At 8 o'clock it was moved by Com. Haldi, seconded by Com. Spicer that the Board adjourn until 9 A. M., July 6th, 1922.

Motion carried. July 6th, 1922. The Board met at 9 o'clock A. M. as per adjournment with all members present and Com. Krantz in the chair.

Moved by Com. Haldi, seconded by Com. Spicer that the report of the Sorenson, Supt. of the County Poor Farm, showing 13 inmates for the month of June, 1922, be accepted, approved and placed on file.

Also report of committee appointed to check offices of the County Treasurer and County Auditor for the quarter ending March 31st, 1922, showing collection of \$26,822.42, disbursements \$18,855.37, balance April 30, 1922, \$1,045,536.02. Commissioners Spicer and Krantz, committee.

Also report of committee appointed to check the following for the quarter ending March 31st, 1922: Office of Clerk of District Court, showing collection of \$4,475.75; Office of Sheriff, showing collection of \$1,727.10; Office of Clerk of County Court, showing collection of \$728.46; Office of County Superintendent of Schools, showing collection of \$25.00; Alfred Haldi and L. W. Tofner, committee.

Also report of T. N. Henderson, Clerk of District Court, for the quarter of June 1922, showing collection of \$27,000. Also report of H. E. Hopkins, Clerk of County Court, for the quarter of June, 1922, showing collection of \$104.50. Motion carried.

Moved by Com. Spicer, seconded by Com. Haldi that the report of Martha Wendt for a strip of land containing 2.92 acres, for road purposes, be accepted, approved and placed on file, and the auditor instructed to issue warrant in payment of \$72.25 to said Martha Wendt, for said land.

On roll call the members voted as follows: Com. Vandenoever, yes; Com. Tofner, yes; Com. Spicer, yes; Com. Haldi, yes; Com. Krantz, yes. Motion carried.

Moved by Com. Tofner, seconded by Com. Vandenoever that the justice quarterly report for the quarter ending June 30th, 1922, be accepted, approved and placed on file, and the auditor instructed to issue warrant in payment of fees, according to law.

Moved by Com. Spicer, seconded by Com. Haldi that the following resolution be accepted, approved and placed on file, and a copy sent to the Judge of the District Court and to F. C. Upton, Prohibitory Officer: WHEREAS, many useful household articles are confiscated in the enforcement of the prohibition laws, and

WHEREAS, the county could make use of many of these articles in taking care of the poor, and thus save Ward County and the tax payers much money, NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the Board of County Commissioners of Ward County, request by this resolution, that the officials, power, and according to law, have all confiscated property pertaining to household goods and cooking utensils, turned over to the Ward County poor house, and by them stored to be given to poor as needed.

Owing to Chairman Krantz being called to serve on the Convancing Board for the Primary Election held June 25th, 1922, and the Board being left without a chairman, O. J. Cleven, Deputy Auditor, acted as temporary chairman and called for a motion to elect a chairman in his absence. Com. Krantz, yes.

Moved by Com. Haldi, seconded by Com. Vandenoever that Com. Spicer act as chairman. Motion carried.

Com. Spicer took the chair. The Board spent the balance of the forenoon in auditing bills. At 12 o'clock it was moved by Com. Haldi, seconded by Com. Tofner that the Board adjourn until 2 P. M.

Motion carried. Afternoon Session. The Board met at 2 P. M. as per adjournment, with all members present: Commissioners Vandenoever, Tofner, Haldi and Spicer, Com. Krantz absent and Com. Spicer in the chair.

Moved by Com. Haldi, seconded by Com. Tofner that the report of A. P. Scofield, sheriff of Ward County, for the month of June, 1922, showing collection of \$732.71, be accepted and the auditor instructed to issue warrant to the amount of \$841.71 in payment of services.

Motion carried. Moved by Com. Vandenoever, seconded by Com. Tofner that the following report of the Ward County Fair Board be accepted, approved and placed on file.

Meeting of the Ward County Fair Board held at the office of the secretary in the Federal Building, in Minot, N. D., at 2 P. M., June 19th, 1922, called to order by August Krantz, president. Members present: Krantz, Spicer, Ehr, Ellison, Wolfe, Brunner, Kamrud, Haldi, Vandenoever, Tofner and Finke.

Minutes read and corrected. Moved by Com. Vandenoever that the minutes as read and corrected be approved. Motion carried.

Moved by Haldi, seconded by Ellison, that the bid of John A. Curran for \$3,090 for building the stock barn be accepted, approved and placed on file. Carried.

A. B. Dinnis appeared before the Board and spoke in favor of concrete for the exhibition building and the matter was discussed by the board at some length.

Moved by Finke, seconded by Dahle, that the bid of Lantz & Mackley for the building of the grand stand—with backs on the building—be accepted, approved and placed on file, subject to satisfactory bond, be accepted. Carried.

Moved by Dahle, seconded by Wolfe, that the bid of the Dakota Building Co. for \$14,270 for the building of the exhibition building with tile be accepted, approved and placed on file, subject to satisfactory bond, be accepted. Carried.

Moved by Brunner, seconded by Finkle, that the bid of the Dakota Building Co. for \$11,270 for the building of the exhibition building with tile be accepted, approved and placed on file, subject to satisfactory bond, be accepted. Carried.

Report of the application for a spur track from the Great Northern Ry. line into the fair grounds was made by the secretary. It was the sense of the board that a high fence should be built along the spur track, the fair grounds facing the Theodore Roosevelt Highway and that the fencing of the remainder of the grounds be left to the committee on grounds.

The secretary was instructed to ascertain what the Great Northern Ry. would do in the matter of fencing on its part of the fair grounds and report at the next meeting.

Moved by Brunner, seconded by Finkle, that the board express formally its thanks to Postmaster Fred L. Anderson for giving the fair board the use of the offices in the Federal Building, in Minot, N. D., for the holding of the Western Vaudiville Managers' Assn., appeared before the board and discussed free attractions.

Moved by Brunner, seconded by Vandenoever, that the fair be extended to four days and include Sept. 5 as the last day. Carried.

Moved by Brunner, seconded by Finkle, to adjourn to July 6. Carried. At 5 o'clock it was moved by Com. Vandenoever, seconded by Com. Haldi that the board adjourn until 9 A. M., July 7th, 1922.

Motion carried. The board met at 9 A. M., on above date, as per adjournment, with the following members present: Commissioners Vandenoever, Tofner, Haldi and Spicer, Com. Krantz absent and Com. Spicer in the chair.

2. The State Board agrees to give general supervision and direction to the work of the County Extension Agent and those of Congress, the rules and regulations of the State of North Dakota and those of the U. S. Department of Agriculture and all such expenses of supervision and direction shall be borne by the State. All the work to be performed under the terms of this agreement shall be in cooperation with the County Extension Agent and in conformity with the general agreement entered into with the Secretary of Agriculture for agricultural work.

3. Salaries paid agents employed under the contract shall be recommended by the State Board and rejected, amended or approved by the County Board.

4. Since a means of discontinuing this work by ballot is expressly provided in the law covering cooperative extension work, copy of which is hereto attached, the County Board agrees that this contract shall remain in force and binding on all parties until the voters of the county shall petition and at the same time the County Board shall continue the same in accordance with the provision made for such an election in the laws of the State of North Dakota, of the Compiled Laws of North Dakota for 1913.

5. The County Extension Agent and the State Board, together with the County Farm Bureau or other local county extension organization shall annually prepare a budget which shall contain a statement of the salaries and expenses of agents employed or to be employed, together with office expenses and clerical hire, and shall submit both to the County Board on or before their April meeting and to the Federal Agricultural Board in the month of June. This budget shall show the amount of funds which can be supplied by the State Board, depending upon the Federal appropriations, and the amount which must be raised by the county. After mutual agreement on the program of work, and on the budget, the annual budget required from the county shall be levied as a tax by the commissioners as provided by law in continuance of this contract.

It is agreed that the funds to be supplied by the State Board for the year July 1st to June 30th, 1923, shall not exceed \$3,000.00.

6. It is understood that all bills for salary of each year, under the County Extension Agent, shall be audited according to the Federal Smith Lever Law by the State Board. Itemized copies of each year's account with necessary vouchers shall remain on public file with the State Board. The amount contributed by said State Board shall be the sum total of salary and expenses and the remainder forwarded for the payment of the County Extension Agent to have filed with the auditor a copy of the current monthly itemized audit accounts.

Chapter 117 County Commissioners May Levy Taxes for Promotion of Diversified Farming. An act to amend and re-enact Section 2263 of the Compiled Laws of North Dakota for the purpose of promoting diversified farming, agricultural development and extension work in this state.

Be it enacted by the Legislative Assembly of the State of North Dakota: 1. That the Board of County Commissioners for any county in this state may, in its discretion, or upon petition of twenty-five per cent of the tax payers of said county, levy a tax upon the taxable property of the county for the purpose of promoting diversified farming and agricultural development and extension work in this state.

2. That the amount of tax levied shall not exceed one-half mill upon the dollar of assessed valuation.

3. All funds raised in accordance with the provision of this act shall be expended by the County Board in such manner as they deem proper to accomplish the purposes set forth in section one of this act.

4. Emergency. Whereas, an emergency exists in this state, it is the policy of the state that immediate steps be taken to encourage and promote diversified farming and agriculture, therefore an emergency exists and this act shall be in force from and after the date of its passage and approval. Approved March 13, 1922.

Senate Bill No. 19 Co-operative Agricultural Work. An act to amend and re-enact Section 2263 of the Compiled Laws of North Dakota for the purpose of promoting diversified farming, agricultural development and extension work in this state.

1. That Section 2263, Article 26 of the Compiled Laws of North Dakota for the purpose of promoting diversified farming, agricultural development and extension work in this state may, in its discretion, or upon petition of twenty-five per cent of the taxpayers of said county, shall annually make an appropriation for the purpose of levying a tax upon the taxable property of the county for the purpose of promoting diversified farming and agricultural development and extension work in this state.

2. That the amount of tax levied shall not exceed one-half mill upon the dollar of assessed valuation.

3. All funds raised in accordance with the provision of this act shall be expended by the County Board in such manner as they deem proper to accomplish the purposes set forth in section one of this act.

4. Emergency. Whereas, an emergency exists in this state, it is the policy of the state that immediate steps be taken to encourage and promote diversified farming and agriculture, therefore an emergency exists and this act shall be in force from and after the date of its passage and approval. Approved March 13, 1922.

Moved by Com. Tofner, seconded by Com. Haldi, that the petition of the tax payers of Logan Range 82, signed by Alfred Stredwick and 70 others, be accepted, approved and placed on file, and the following resolution be adopted: That the organization of said township be spread on the minutes:

WHEREAS, a majority of the legal voters of Logan Township, 154, North of Range 82 West, in Ward County, North Dakota, which Congressional Township contains more than 40,000 acres, and has assessed valuation exceeding \$40,000, has this day filed with the county auditor of Ward County, a petition, signed by the Board of County Commissioners that the said township be organized as a new township according to the provisions of Section 1943, Compiled Laws of North Dakota, and

WHEREAS, the express wishes of the legal voters of said township shall be named "Logan". NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the township be organized under the name of "Logan", commencing at the Southwest corner of Nedrose Township, thence East a distance of six miles along the boundary line of the Township of Logan, thence North to the corner of Willis Township, thence six miles West to the Northwest corner of Willis Township, thence South to the point of beginning, being a square tract of land, containing thirty six (36) sections.

And be it further resolved, that the first township meeting of said township shall be held in Logan, N. D., on the 25th day of July, 1922, at 2 o'clock P. M., and the County Auditor of Ward County is hereby authorized to draw up the petition and deliver same to the sheriff, with instructions that same be posted according to provisions in Section 4072 of the Laws of North Dakota.
