Poultry experts declare that culling of the average farm flock decreases the cost of producing eggs by from 5 to 15 cents per dozen. Beals, well known poultry expert of Fargo, has been secured to aid the state poultry specialist, O. A. Barton, who will cooperate with the county agents in holding the demonstrations.


