Regular Meeting of the County Board at Devils Lake, Ramsey Co., N. D.

The regular meeting of the board of county commissioners of Ramsey county, North Dakota.

Monday, January 5th, 1914.
The board met at 2 o'clock P. M. County Auditor J. A. Kramer called the meeting to order. There were present Commissioners Johnson, Theilm, Maloney, McNaughton and Hoystad.

Moved and seconded that Commissioner McNaughton be elected as chairman of this board for the ensuing year. Carried, all members voting "yes."
Moved and carried that tax certificate No. 132, sale of 1913, covering the south-east (SE 1-4) quarter of section one (1), township 151, range 62, be called in and cancelled and paid at the rate of seven per cent as is customary in all such cases for the reason that said taxes were paid but through error were not marked off the tax list by the county treasurer.

A petition signed by Alex. A. E. Barron asking to have his 1913 personal property valuation reduced to the sum of \$5.00 for the reason that he was assessed for two horses in the sum of \$7.00 and as one is practically worthless and also that he was assessed for a piano in the sum of \$90.00. Same being used for about twenty years, was read and on motion granted, and the auditor was instructed to issue a refunding order for the sum of \$3.92. Same being the amount of the taxes overpaid. A petition signed by E. L. Duell asking to have a refunding order issued in the sum of \$3.55 same being for the 1911 taxes on lots 15 and 16, block 3, of Ruge's second addition to the City of Devils Lake, for the reason that said tax receipt was written but was not paid for, and that said taxes were sold at the annual tax sale December 9th, 1913, for the years 1911 and 1912, and a tax certificate issued for the same was read and on motion granted.

A petition signed by M. N. 
