

HANNA ANNOUNCES HIS CANDIDACY

Governor Hanna has made formal announcement of his candidacy to succeed himself as governor of the state. Mr. Hanna has made a splendid record and his announcement will come as a pleasure to his many friends over the state. The following is his announcement:

To the Editor:

Through the columns of your paper I wish to announce my candidacy for the republican nomination for governor at the primaries to be held June 24, next.

For a little over a year I have had the honor of being governor of this state and during that time have honestly endeavored to bring about a better and more economic system in administering the affairs of the state and state institutions, keeping in mind at all times that service and efficiency are equally important with economy. It is impossible to carry out these ideas and fully establish them in two years; therefore I am asking the people for a nomination and election to a second term, that I may carry to a conclusion those business principles which have been inaugurated.

I recommended to the last legislative assembly the election of governors for a term of four years and that he should be ineligible to a second consecutive term, believing that a four year term would give him ample time to carry out any plans he might have for a betterment of conditions as to the state and state institutions. The business of the state is a big business and it takes time to get a thorough grasp of it and it cannot be done satisfactorily in a single term of two years.

The last legislative assembly authorized the governor to employ expert accountants from without the state to make a thorough check-up of the books and accounts of the state and state institutions, also the coun-

for the state of North Dakota to aid in bringing into the state factories and people who will develop our lignite, our clay for pottery and brick, the use of straw in the manufacture of paper and other commodities, and industries of all kinds; and I believe the money that might be spent or work of this kind would be of infinite value.

Recognizing the importance of a system of good roads, which in my judgment will materially add to the rapid development of our state, I favor an economic plan which will bring about this much needed public improvement, and believe it can be done by the state, in co-operation with the counties and the federal government. The best interests of the state demand that we keep the people we now have in North Dakota and also to bring in more from the outside; therefore, I hope that the immigration movement, which was started by the state a year ago will be made more effective and shall do all in my power to push the movement forward.

I desire to see the resources of our state developed, that our young men may not feel the necessity of going to some other state or to Canada to satisfy their ambitions, for they will soon be called upon to take a part in state and business affairs. The importance of giving our young people in rural districts an opportunity to acquire a liberal education cannot be over-estimated and I am in favor of the consolidated rural schools and in the upbuilding and betterment of our school system.

Further, I am in favor of the farm credit land bank and made recommendations regarding this to the state legislature a year ago.

The work inaugurated in North Dakota along the lines outlined is only partially accomplished, and having practically retired from business and having the time to give to public questions, I ask the people of North Dakota for a nomination and election to a second term as governor. If nominated and elected, I shall give my best endeavor to the carrying out of these suggestions. That which appeals to me most in my candidacy for a second term is that as governor I will have greater opportunities to do much for North Dakota and her people—a state and people who have done much for me.
