


BIG CELEBRATION AT WEBSTER

MURDER CHARGED TO HOMESTEADER

Williston N. D., June 20.—McKenzie and William counties have on hand what seems certain to prove a sensational murder case, the victim being the man whose remains were taken from the river at the Nelson ferry June 7. Several people believe they recognize the corps as that of Henry Sexse a bachelor homesteader who has resided across the river a few years. Some of his neighbors are absolutely sure of the identity. The flesh of the face had been eaten away by fish but certain marks seem unmistakable, such as the shoes on his feet, a peculiar cut in one shoe, a crooked thumb and a prominent lower jaw.

S. Burns also a homesteader, whose home is three miles from the Sexse place, in McKenzie county, is in the Williston jail charged with killing his neighbor who when found had a bullet wound in his breast.

Burns, who has a wife and children, claims Sexse sold him his land and left for Canada. The deed of transfer, believed to be forged cannot be found. There is much apparently strong evidence against Burns but until it has been sifted and a hearing held it seems fairer not to repeat it.

The time of the hearing which will be in McKenzie county, has not been set. County Attorney Converse of McKenzie county is in the city today.

A sort of inquest was held over the remains the day they were found and they were interred in a box on the river bank. Later they were taken up, services held and interment made in the Nessen cemetery.

Yesterday, Coroner Distad, Court Stenographer Henyon and witnesses went to Nesson and another inquest was held.

The hearing will establish some strong, circumstantial evidence. Sexse bore an excellent reputation.
