## M. O. BUSINESS GIVEN A JOLT

At the Commercial Club rooms in this city there has been an exhibition two orders of goods, one being purchased of a local firm, and the other one sent for to Sears & Roebuck, Chicago. When these goods were ordered neither firm knew that the goods they furnished were going into competition, so it is fair to assume that it is a fair sample of what could be expected of each firm. Each bill was ordered to be the best goods and the kinds and quantities the same. The goods furnished by Sears & Roebuck laid down in this city cost \$34.31, while those purchased of a local firm cost only \$31.55. After a careful inspection there is no one but will admit that the goods purchased of the local firm are far superior to this sent for.

President Kelly of the Commercial Club appointed a committee of three well known Devils Lake people to make a thorough test and inspection of the two bills of goods. This committee consists of Bert Williams, chef at the Colonial hotel, T. A. Haslam and E. J. Chamberlain. The letter of Mr. Williams appears below and states what he knows about them and the report of Messrs Haslam and Chamberlain will be a more thorough one and they will report later. They have sent samples of both orders to Prof. Ladd for analysis.

At your request I have examined the goods contained in five boxes shipped from Sears-Roebuck, Chicago, and of six boxes obtained from a local merchant, all of which we found in the west store of the opera house building and wish to report that, while I found some of the Sears-Roebuck shipment of good quality, most of it was short weight and of an unknown brand.

The goods from the local merchant were mostly of standard and well known brands. The quality was good and full weight as represented, and had passed the test of the pure food law as to sanitary condition and measure, and I have no hesitation in asserting that the goods obtained from the local merchant were, from an economic standpoint, by far the best value.
