

**NEW DRUG ACT  
NOW IN EFFECT**

FEDERAL LAW VERY STRINGENT, MAKING IT ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE FOR "DOPE FIENDS" TO GET NARCOTICS.

The federal law governing the sale of drugs went into effect yesterday. Hereafter all physicians, dentists, and veterinaries can issue orders for the sale of narcotics like opium or its derivatives only on blanks furnished by the government, and druggists are prohibited from selling habit forming drugs except upon such orders.

The law is very drastic, the penalty is severe, and under the act, it will be practically impossible for persons addicted to the drug habit to obtain morphine, heroin, cocaine, or other noxious drugs, except upon a physician's order.
