HON. H. M. CREEL GIVES HIS VIEWS

The World, Devils Lake, N. Dak.

At this time there exists the gravest crisis this country has seen since the Civil War. When one reads the arguments of the Democratic party and the eulogistic statements anent Mr. Wilson setting forth the reasons why he should be elected, and then examines his record in Mexican affairs alone, I am convinced that there are a large number of our own people incompetent to vote.

If every voter could read the article on the Mexican policy of President Wilson by Manuel Calero, Secretary of Foreign Relations under Madero, I venture to say that Mr. Wilson's vote in the Electoral College would be negligible.

The statement that Mr. Wilson inherited the Mexican condition from President Taft is untrue, as Huerta came into control a few days before Mr. Taft went out of office and he, Mr. Taft, told me in his private office at the executive mansion that he could not act in eleven days, and had refrained from any expression officially as he did not wish to embarrass Mr. Wilson or in any way commit the incoming administration.

Mexico has five million Indians—five million blacks, and three million white people—the country being dominated by a few turbulent races with a following of less than 100,000, less than one per cent of the population of this country, the blacks and Indians carrying little and knowing less of the right of franchise. Huerta came into power just as President Billingshurst of Peru was deposed, this country and Europe recognizing the new government born by military revolt and loss of life. Madero had braved the strongest and best government for Mexico that of Porfirio Diaz, and thru the loss of many lives ascended to the control of Mexico and by the same fortune was overthrown. Huerta was the strongest man in Mexico and recognized by the whole world except this country and four minor South American Republics which refused recognition at the behest of Mr. Wilson.

This country, within its rights under international law could have withheld recognition of Huerta, but it certainly had no right to use the powerful armament of this country actively by armed interference to depose Huerta, which Mr. Wilson did. Briefly summing up his course it is as follows:

He captured Vera Cruz, sent John Lind there, told Huerta to resign, get out, that he would not tolerate him; now Huerta was an usurper, but this was a matter solely within the province of the people of Mexico and by every precedent beyond the power or right of Mr. Wilson to intervene. But he did, stopped the shipment of arms from Germany to Huerta, let the Americans to be murdered by Mexicans who were saved by the German and English men of war, our naval force being ordered away altho the grave danger to our people was known by the authorities at Washington—at the same time we supplied Villa with arms and munitions of war, which he used later to kill our people on our soil at Columbus, New Mexico. Thru Villa, Carranza with the powerful aid of this country under the guidance of Mr. Wilson, overcame Huerta. Then followed a reign of terror in Mexico up to the present. Women were ravished, nuns were not spared, church property was confiscated and destroyed, corn and other provisions were shipped out of Mexico leaving her population crying for food and dying with hunger, all the bullion and gold were shipped to this country to buy munitions of war to enable the several bandits to carry on their cruel war actuated only by lust and desire to enrich themselves by unlawful means.

There is ample proof at hand to indicate that Mr. Wilson at one time contemplated recognizing Villa who has killed more men and ravished more women and stolen more private property, caused more suffering than any one man since the feudal age, but Carranza came to the front in the ever changing fortunes of this unhappy nation, and then Mr. Wilson aided him, allowed him to transport his armed forces through our territory and when Villa arrived at the frontier town of Agua Prieta Carranza, thru the aid of

this country found himself powerless, his rage knew no bounds, and the murder of nineteen Americans at Santa Isabel and the raid upon Columbus. Some eight days afterwards an expedition of American soldiers entered Mexico to catch Villa at any and all hazards, with a slow lumbering supply train ambling along over the sand swept deserts of Mexico between two lines of Mexican railroads that Carranza refused to let us use, also forbid us to enter any towns, we obeyed, and after going some 150 miles after Villa mounted on Mexican horses, injured to the climate, with a week's start of our forces, resembling a tortoise after a jack-rabbit, we halted fighting at Paral, then it was reported that Villa had died of wounds and Carranza forces were to bring in his body, then his head and after they had killed and buried Villa some seven times, Carranza notified our government that any movement of our troops except to withdraw north would be resisted. General Pershing was ordered to proceed south and east, sending out two troops of the tenth cavalry southeast in the midst of some ten thousand Mexican troops, our soldiers were massacred, both the troop commanders being killed, since then this American punitive expedition remains, sent to catch Villa, many times killed, and now as lively as a cricket, attacking the Carranza forces in the open—why don't Pershing proceed to complete his task? No, Mr. Wilson is in a state of "watchful waiting," waiting for what? The result of election next Tuesday.

The European countries have one thousand million of dollars invested in Mexico and Mr. Wilson by his active interference at Vera Cruz has made this nation liable for the collection of this debt, had he simply refused to not recognize Huerta and kept out of Mexico we would not be in this plight. Mr. Wilson has done all he could in a rambling disgraceful way to bring us into war with Mexico and it was the weakness of Huerta and cowardness of Carranza and vacillating mind of our president that we are not now actively engaged in war with Mexico—Just about the kind of war that anyone would expect a man like Mr. Wilson to maintain, but thru his policy we have armed Mexican troops—and there are now some 200,000 well armed soldiers in Mexico ready to fight us. We are surely drifting to war with that country; Mr. Wilson is largely to blame. As I said in a former article on this subject from Mr. Wilson's standpoint as to Huerta it was our plain duty to keep out of Mexico and keep Mexicans out of this country. When the war in Europe is over we will be called upon under the Monroe Doctrine and Mr. Wilson's folly in the Vera Cruz campaign to make good the immense losses of those countries in Mexico, and we will have to do it, or Europe will. There is no escape from this position—until then if Mr. Wilson is rejected Mexico will continue to suffer horrors beyond our comprehension. Mr. Wilson is an innovator, but a mighty ignorant one; he found in Mexico a propitious field to apply his theories and the result is hell.

The Mexican policy of Mr. Wilson should condemn him in the eyes of all intelligent and honest American citizens. Also outside the Mexican question, he has not been fairly shown to the American people. That Wall St. is behind Mr. Hughes is ridiculous. Mr. McAdoo, Wilson's son-in-law is well and favorably known in Wall St. The firms making munitions of war are kindly disposed to Mr. Wilson, he wobbles along with England as to the censoring of our mails on neutral waters, they ship all they can make and get paid for in this line. Walters-Pierce Oil Co. were to profit by Villa's success, and the downfall of Huerta at all events, friendly to the Lord Coudery interests at Tampico, this firm is not unfriendly to Wilson. Henry Ford and Edison are working for him; also Pierpont Morgan. They are poor men! The millions of federal office holders that the pie counter contribute liberally that the pie counter may still be accessible. No, Mr. Wilson has more money than Mr. Hughes could ever dream of having behind him, he has the Press of this country largely in his favor and has had thruout his administration, and locally he has Annaniases galore to exploit his wonderful policies; for instance the big crops and prices of 1915 are attributed to him; yet no mention is made of the 37 cent wheat when

Cleveland was president. If he is responsible for the big crops he is also to blame for the black rust this year. No, the war in Europe alone has brot this temporary prosperity that will soon fade with its end. The Underwood tariff bill is lauded to the skies, it has never been tried out due to European war, except when they promised us free sugar and then changed to the old duty. The Rural Bank system is a myth and will never be invoked by the farmers of this country. The Federal Reserve banking system originated with the Republicans. Mr. Hughes was complimented by the labor organizations of this country for his support while governor of New York and was noted for his unerring course against the money power of Wall St., in his thorough suits against the powerful insurance companies and gas companies. Mr. Wilson wrote an article on labor before he knew he would be asking their votes, saying that it was worthless, wanting large compensation and giving as little in return as possible and he might as well tell the truth as our farmers can testify to. He gave us a bill entitled the Adamson Eight-hour bill, that under the rules of our state legislature invalidates it, the bill being defective not expressing the text of the measure. It is simply ten hours pay for eight hours work and will not stand the test in courts. Moreover he told the railroads that he would not let the later State Commission to allow the roads to increase their tariffs so as to raise the increase of one hundred million dollars that would be required to meet this raise in wages if effective, which I venture to say Mr. Wilson doubted, but he and Samuel Gompers who is always working some one else and is now out for Wilson strong, chucked over what would be the great gain in labor votes carrying little for the farmers who have to pay this extra toll if it stood the test of judicial scrutiny which I think they doubted, but it was politics. Inevitable government should be avoided but when the people take upon themselves the direct selection of their officials they should remember the great responsibility they incur and select the best available men and if in the present issue they do this, they will vote for Hughes, McCumber, Frazier and the whole ticket. I venture notwithstanding the educated

utterance follows that are going around saying, "I am a Republican, but it looks mighty like Wilson I can't understand it," or "I am a Wilson Republican," that Hughes, McCumber, Frazier, et al will be elected hands down Nov. 7th.
