FANCHER CLASS IS HIGH WINNER

Educational Exhibits of Students Attracted Notice

LIST IS ANNOUNCED

1921 Exhibits Expected To Show a Marked Increase

Children in rural school districts excelled in nearly every instance of competition with those of Devils Lake in exhibits at the county fair under the classification of educational department, the prize winning records furnished by William Guy, secretary of the fair association show.

Children in Fancher township school, number three, appear to have led in all classes where entries were made. Other schools gaining prominence among the prize winners, were: South Minnewaukan, Garake, Sullivan, Royal, Doyon, DeGroat, Webster, Hampden, Triumph and Cray.

One Devils Lake boy captured a first prize in the manual training department, John Baird's offering gaining him the award.

Contests were centered in examples of proficiency attained in routine school work, including writing, drawing, sketching, paper cutting, weaving, sewing, some art work, illustrated story telling, nature studies in pencil sketches, week study, and rope work for the boys. Manual training exhibits and sewing also were prominent in displays.

Secretary Guy has stated since the fair, that in another year, he is expectant of seeing a necessity for much larger quarters to house school children's exhibits as interest in the first fair had only just begun when the dates of the event big, to the school children arrived. He already urges rural teachers to begin preparations for 1921 fair exhibits, with the opening of fall term in September.

ILLINOIS COAL MEN STRIKE

Seven Thousand Walk Out In Harrisburg District

Harrisburg, Ill., July 28.—Seven thousand coal miners in this district have joined the strikers. Not a shaft in the eleventh sub-district is working according to reports here.

Chicago, July 28.—Strikes of day laborers in the southern Illinois coal fields, with demands for higher wages, have closed more than a score of mines in the important Franklin county coal fields. Reports from the district around Belleville said that approximately 12,000 men were idle.

The day laborers, including drivers, timbermen and pump men, average \$5.50 per day and are demanding \$2 per day increase.

Railroad Lays Off 12,000 Men

Philadelphia, Pa.—Preparations were being made today by Pennsylvania railroad officials here to dismiss 12,000 men in the eastern operating division. In announcing this action the officials of the company said they had taken the step to "bring about improved efficiency in the operating forces and to reduce operating expenses." Approximately 10 percent of the total number employed in the eastern division will be let out.
