Dimpled Knees Attract Judge

Atlanta, Ga.—"There ought to be a law against it," mused State Senator Wilkinson, viewing a dimpled knee as its owner posed for a graceful dive. So Senator Wilkinson had two stringent blue laws before the Senate today, one governing bathing conditions, the other on "character protection." The Senator's observations brought these recommendations:

That women's bathing costumes should conceal the knees as well as the shoulders—and conceal both the knees and shoulders.

That bathing by men and women in the same pool should not be permitted—at least a rope barrier should be interposed.

That "watching and spying" should be punished by fines of not less than \$500 nor more than \$5,000. His character protection" measure would forbid girls between 14 and 16 having "company" without written consent of their parents.
