



CLOTHING MEN MAKE PROTEST

New York Manufacturers Seek Changed Conditions and Lower Wages.

SAY BUSINESS IS HARMED

Return to Piece Work is One of the Demands Made—Union Officials Predict Fight—Question May Be Arbitrated.

General revision of working and wage agreements "necessitated by business depression and a prediction of lower prices" is sought by the Clothing Manufacturers' association of New York in proposals adopted for presentation to the Amalgamated Clothing Workers' union. Union officials, when apprised of the employers' demands, said it was probable counter-proposals would be made and the points in dispute then submitted to arbitration.

New contracts must be drawn to enable the clothing industry in New York to compete with other clothing markets, the employers declared. They claim the loss of business in New York is more severe than in any other clothing center, and that wages are fifty per cent higher there.

The demands call for a return to the piece-work system, the right of manufacturers to establish their own methods of discipline and to install improved machinery to reduce labor cost.

Women Workers For Nonpartisan Program Busy In Campaigning

Ramsey county's farmer women will not be outdone by the women of the city. Hundreds of woman voters throughout the district met with their husbands Saturday to complete plans of aiding to carry the November 2d elections for the Nonpartisan league program.

The wives of city workers are not behind their country friends either. Friday night a band of workers gathered to thresh out details of the city campaign.

Every woman in the city seeking the protection of the law for the benefit of the girl compelled by necessity to earn her livelihood will vote for every candidate endorsed by the Nonpartisan league — and vote NO five times on the initiated measures.

HAIL LAW SAVES MILLIONS FOR THE FARMERS--TOTAL ACERAGE COSTS, 28 CENTS

1,572 More Losses Than In 1919 With More Than 12,000 Acres Insured

BISMARCK, Oct. 29—The state hail insurance indemnity tax for the season just closed will be 25 cents per acre of insured crop, it is announced by S. A. Olsness, commissioner of insurance, and Martin S. Hagen, manager of the state hail insurance department.

Altho there were 1,572 more crop losses this year than last the state has not been obliged to increase its rate over last year.

Farmers of North Dakota who insured their crops under the state law received the same protection for 25 cents per acre premium plus three cent flat tax, as that afforded by private line companies at 77 cents per acre.

Twelve Million Acres Insured
On the basis of 12,132,974 acres of cropped land insured under the state hail insurance law, the old line companies would have collected \$9,342,389 from the farmers. The saving effected to the agricultural industry of the state this year again passes the \$5,000,000 mark.

Two outstanding features of the administration of the hail insurance department during its second year of existence are the low cost of operation or overhead, and the economical expense of adjusting claims in comparison with the same statistics on private line companies. The overhead of the department is 2.85 per cent. Statistics on file in the insurance commissioner's office show the ratio of overhead to total premium receipts ranges from 25 per cent to 40 per cent.

The cost of adjusting the claims under the private line system is commonly figured at \$10 per claim, according to Mr. Hagen. The state performed the same work at a cost of only \$4.60.

CALL OFF BUFFALO STRIKE

Clothing Workers, Out Since June 22 Last, Decide to Return to Their Old Jobs.

Buffalo's clothing workers' strike called June 22 last, to force from the local manufacturers an increase in wages and recognition of their union, has ended. Striking tailors, finishers and others who laid down their tools to enforce their demands, are now applying for their old jobs.

The strike was called last June following the refusal of the local manufacturers to increase the Buffalo scale to the plane in existence in Rochester, where union officials say there is a slight advance over Buffalo prices. The workers also demanded recognition of their union. Several efforts were made to adjust the difficulties but without result. The manufacturers have recently filled many of the strikers' places with nonunion workers, and the employees say that these workers will not be discharged to make room for the strikers. The workers are now working on a piecework production basis.
