NEW SETTLERS FROM NORWAY IS PLAN OF STATE

Immigration Department Will Go Across The Pond

The North Dakota Department of Immigration is planning to send a man to Norway and Sweden in the

near future for the purpose of including emigration to this country. It is understood that about 25,000 people will emigrate from the Scandinavian Peninsula the coming year into the northwest. "We believe that there are no finer class of immigrants than the people from Norway and Sweden," said Commissioner J. H. Worst, "and we hope to be able to bring over a number of good Scandinavian farmers and men and women who will be willing to work on our farms and in our homes and thus relieve the labor shortage which is so acute at this time in the state.

The Scandinavian people know considerable about agriculture and have proved to be fine citizens and an excellent force in helping to build up the state."

LARGE WHEAT YIELD CAUSED CUT IN COSTS

North Dakota Yield Was However Only 9.4 Bushels

Agricultural College, N. D., Feb. 3.—The average acre cost of growing North Dakota in 1920 was greater than in 1919, but the average bushel cost, \$2.45 per bushel, was 30 cents less than the 1919 cost due to the larger yield in 1920, according to Experiment Station Bulletin 144, "Cost of Producing Wheat and Other Crops in North Dakota in 1920." The 1920 figures were from estimates of 619 farmers secured by the farm management department of the college extension division.

The average 1920 yield was 9.4 bushels an acre. The bulletin is free upon request to the experiment station.
