

Machine Guns For Booze Warfare Arrive In State

Minneapolis, May 20.—The machine guns which will be used in combating whisky stills, were received and given a trial on the capital grounds by Adjutant General Fraser, assisted by Captain M. W. Murphy of Fargo. The trial was witnessed by Governor Frazier and Assistant Attorney General Anderson. The guns are a 1921 Thompson submachine gun. It is sold only

to certified authorities, and is well adapted for the work in hand. It is very light, considering its effectiveness and can be handled like an ordinary rifle. "It pours pistol ball or buck shot from its muzzle like water from a hose, at the rate of 1,500 shots per minute," said Captain Murphy. "Chief Busher and his deputies will have no trouble stopping any auto bandit that comes in range of this gun," added General Fraser.

Frank Palmer Passes To The Great Beyond After Life of Good And Many Kindly Deeds

Frank Palmer, following a long illness, has passed to the great beyond, dying at his home Wednesday.

Probably no other name is more closely linked with the early history of Devils Lake and the Lake Region than that of Frank Palmer. He was a pioneer of pioneers, and boasted that to his is due the credit for turning the first sod in the Lake Region ever turned by a white man, and planting therein the first grain seeds. This was in 1881, before the homesteaders invaded the new country, then known to be the land of the Sioux Indians, who were driven out of Minnesota after the famous or rather infamous uprising of that merciless Sioux chief, Little Crow, who himself also escaped

to Devils Lake and attempted to rehabilitate his forces for a new uprising.

Mr. Palmer has been living a retired life for a number of years, living with his sister-in-law, Miss Prang at 1001 Second St., Devils Lake. He was born in Eaton, Preble Co., Ohio, May 1, 1847, and came to the Lake Region in 1888 from Fort Peck, Montana. His wife died last year. He had served in the Civil War, enlisting when he was only 14 1/2 years of age, having been one of the youngest soldiers in the Union army, and serving from 1862 to the end of the war. Mr. Palmer served as state senator from Benson county from 1891 to 1895.
