### FARM BUREAU SPONSORS BIG EXCHANGE AND SALE DAY HERE

Realizing that many farmers are over-stocked with good pure bred livestock and that others are in need of cattle, hogs, sheep and poultry, the Ramsey County Farm Bureau will undertake to assist in bringing the buyer and seller together at the First Annual Pure Bred Livestock and Poultry Exchange and Sale.

The farmer is constantly confronted with the problem of where they may sell or trade a sire which he is thru with. In many instances very good sires have been sent to slaughter because the owner did not know his neighbor was looking for just such an animal. The same holds true in the case of poultry. It is thought that this difficulty may be removed by staging each year an exchange day and auction sale.

The date set for this event is November 21 and 22nd. The Ramsey County Fair Association will donate the use of the fair grounds buildings. All stock will be on the grounds on the morning of November 21st and that day will be devoted to exchange among the owners. The second day will be devoted to an auction sale at which the remaining stock will be sold to the highest bidder. Some very high class stock has already been entered.

The expense of the exchange and sale will be kept to minimum and this expense will be pro rated among those who enter stock. Not to exceed \$3.00 will be charged for cattle, \$2.00 for hogs, 25 cents for turkeys, and 10 cents for chickens. The money paid in will be used to pay for hay, straw, advertising and help.

It is very important that entries be sent in early in order that arrangements may be made for proper housing and feeding. No entries will be received later than 10:00 A. M. November 21st.

The success of this event depends entirely upon the support it gets from those who have stock to dispose of. If it proves successful this year it will undoubtedly be made an annual event.

The committee in charge is as follows: Frank H. Hyland, Chas. Pillsbury, B. E. Baldwin, D. J. Rapp and T. A. Haslam. Entries should be sent to Frank Hyland or Chas. Pillsbury at the earliest possible date.

### RUTTEN WINS FOR SHERIFF

The entire list of republican nominees seem to have won out at the general election held yesterday, with the possible exception of L. J. Frazier, who is a candidate for U. S. Senator. It will be impossible to secure the amount of the majorities received for several days.

In the county the only real contest was that for the sheriff's office between D. J. Rutten and Martin Olsen, and with most of the precincts

already in Rutten appears to be the winner by a majority of about 300 votes. All other county officers are re-elected. The Journal won the designation as official newspaper by a large majority. The amount of the majorities received by each candidate will be given in the next issue of The World.

B. J. Monahan of Upham, game warden for the north half of the state, was in the city several days the fore part of the week visiting with friends and at the same time looking up the hunting conditions.

A free concert will be given next Sunday by the Devils Lake concert band at the Grand theatre commencing at three o'clock, to which the general public is cordially invited. 
### JOHN SERUMGARD ANSWERS LAST SUMMONS TUES.

John Serumgard, who had been a resident in this community since 1892, passed away at his home at 816 Sixth street, last Tuesday morning after a long illness. Until the year 1918 the deceased had been engaged in farming near Webster, but suffered a stroke of paralysis and was compelled to retire from farming and move to town. For some time he has been an invalid. He was one of the most respected citizen in the community, and the news of his death will be learned with considerable regret by his many friends all over the Lake Region.

The deceased was born on November 15, 1869 near Hanska, Minn., and moved to Devils Lake in 1892. On his arrival here he was for several years in partnership with his brother Thor in conducting a dray line in this city, and later purchased a farm near Webster, which he worked until 1918, when he was compelled to quit on account of his health. He was a member of the Workmen, Maccabees and Yeoman orders. He leaves to mourn his death, his widow, Anna Serumgard, six children, namely Alice, Anna, Mildred, Edith and Anton, and two brothers Siver and Ole of this city. The funeral arrangements will be made some time today.
