# CREPE-SATIN HOLDS LEAD; OVER-BLOUSES AND TUNICS

AMONG other two-faced but pretty things that go to make up this mysterious and enchanting world there is crepe-satin, whose two-faced quality is much admired and adds greatly to its popularity. Designers seem to find pleasure in contrasting its bright satin side with its dull silk side—and by this means they add interest to the frocks made of it. For the simplest afternoon dresses this use of two surfaces is often the only decorative element. In these the satin surface is used outside in one-piece frocks, which are banded by the material with the dull surface outward. Bands usu-

rapturously welcomed and therefore appears, almost daily, in new developments. It arrived, long, slim and straight as a straw, but designers soon became restive and began varying its line, which remains long but not always straight. Now the tunic-blouse indulges in all sorts of vagaries; it goes to greater lengths than its forebears; it takes on a Chinese aspect (as in this blouse pictured); it models itself on the pattern of a kitchen apron or a man's nightshirt; indulges in painted decorations or is satisfied to remain simple if made of splendid

ally extend across the front and sides of skirts and sometimes are introduced in the sleeves.

When greater elaboration is required with this double-surfaced material fur-bands and fancy buttons, or cabochons, or narrow fancy braids may be introduced. An attractive two-piece frock, shown in the picture, is an example. Its skirt, made with crepe side out, has three inverted plaits at each side. The front portion, which wraps across from right to left, is turned back, revealing the satin side, which forms a panel. The bodice is an over-

fabrics, like gold or silver cloths, embroidered, rich velvet or metallic brocades.

The blouse shown here is pretty and simple and is made of printed silk with a flared flounce of plain satin set on at the bottom. It is a pleasing variation of the straightline tunic-blouse, popular for afternoon wear. But with all its modifications nothing has appeared that outshines the earlier tunic-blouses of crepe de chine with decorations of silk or bead embroidery. Metallic lace does not sound very

blouse, in which bands are set together, alternating the two surfaces. It has a round neck and fastens at the left side, where it is bordered with a band of fur. Inside the fur-band a border of small jet cabochons is placed. The sleeves are finished in the same way. Long loops of the material, satin side out, hang from the shoulders at the back, contriving to add the flowing and graceful lines that give the costume unity.

Because of its two surfaces and for other very good reasons, crepe satin leads the procession of fabrics popular for afternoon gowns, and for tunics it dispenses supremacy with crepe de chine. Even in expensive grades it is rich looking, highly lustrous on the satin side and not easily wrinkled. Added to these are dependable wearing qualities.

practical and proves to be a fine choice for a dinner blouse which proves satisfactory to the tourist. It takes up so little room in the suitcase and is not easily mused. A single black satin slip will make a satisfactory background for many blouses.

With all this fervor for the tunic-blouse the familiar overblouse continues to compel more attention than its rival. It is widely varied and its story so brief. Many late arrivals have high necklines and long sleeves, featured as dressy as well as tailored types. In the former, fanciful cuffs and long sleeves, with colorful embroidery of wood or silk are new and noteworthy style points. Black satin has gained some prominence for vest-dresses and tailored blouses, and crepe de chine holds its own as the most popular fabric.

### Danish Farms Thrive

During the last few years the farmers of Denmark have been so prosperous that at least 50 per cent of all farms are now electrified. The average farm is about fifty to seventy-five acres. The farmers specialize in the raising of grain, sugar beets and fodder, as well as in dairying. Farm tenancy is negligible, the government encouraging, through loans, the policy of farm ownership. Most of the farms obtain their power from central plants, which are, to a large extent, owned cooperatively by the consumers. Electric power is used for lighting, threshing, grinding, feed cutting, pumping and for other farm tasks.
