The deceased leaves three sons and six daughters to mourn her loss. J. E. R. A. and D. H. Thacker; Miss C. Thacker and Mrs. J. T. Gentleman of London, Ont.; Mrs. T. G. McIntyre of St. Thomas, Ont.; Mrs. J. Skelton, of East Zorra, Ont.; Mrs. Jessie Abrams of Hamilton, and Mrs. L. L. Martin, Elmhurst, Cal., also three brothers, Capt. Neil Brown of Buffalo, N. Y.; Dr. Angus Brown of Rochester, Ind.; and Rev. H. W. Brown of Morgan Park, Ill. Catherine Brown was born at Islay, Argyshire, Scotland, in May, 1818. She came to Glengarry, Lower Canada, with her parents at the age of 12 years. On the 28th of October 1838, she was united in marriage to Robert Thacker and resided in London, Ont., for a time, afterwards removing to Woodstock, Ont., where she resided until Sept. 12, 1862, when she came to North Dakota. "Grandma" Thacker was a life long Christian. During her last illness, which lasted just a week, she bore the suffering with fortitude, realizing that her illness would prove fatal. Few death scenes are as calm and peaceful as her's. The presence and tender ministrations of her beloved family and numerous friends soothed the closing hours. The funeral services were held in the M. E. church Wednesday, Oct. 10 at 9 o'clock p. m., Rev. W. H. Gooderham officiating. The floral offerings were numerous and beautiful. A large concourse of relatives and friends followed the remains to their last resting place.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO CONSTITUTION.

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the State of North Dakota, the Senate concurring:

That the following amendment to the constitution of the state of North Dakota agreed to by the fifth legislative assembly of the state of North Dakota, be and the same is hereby agreed to, and said amendment shall be submitted to the people at the next general election.

AMENDMENT.

§ 1. Section 76 of article 3 of the constitution of the state of North Dakota is amended so as to read as follows:

§ 76. The governor shall have power in conjunction with the board of pardon of which the governor shall be ex-officio a member and the other members of which shall consist of the attorney general of state of North Dakota, the chief justice of the supreme court of the state of North Dakota and two qualified electors who shall be appointed by the governor, to remit fines and forfeitures, to grant reprieves, commutations and pardons after conviction for all offenses except treason and cases of impeachment; but the legislative assembly may by law regulate the manner in which the remission of fines, pardons, commutations and reprieves may be applied for.

Upon conviction for treason the governor shall have the power to suspend the execution of sentence until the case shall be reported to the legislative assembly at its next regular session, when the legislative assembly shall either pardon or commute the sentence, direct the execution of the sentence or grant further reprieve.

The governor shall communicate to the legislative assembly at each regular session each case of remission of fine, reprieve, commutation or pardon granted by the board of pardon, stating the name of the convict, the crime for which he is convicted, the sentence and its date and the date of remission, commutation, pardon or reprieve, with their reasons for granting the same.
