## TEUTONS SHORN OF WAR POWER

Peace Terms Put Germany on Par With Humblest Nation in Military Way.

### LIMIT ARMY TO 100,000

Foe Must Accept Conditions Imposed Or Suffer Consequences—German Emissons to Be Called to Versailles, March 20.

Paris, March 12.—With the military terms adopted and rapid progress being made toward completion of the other provisions, it was learned today that the preliminary peace treaty may be ready to present to the Germans by March 20.

From the greatest war maker in the world, Germany will be reduced to a military status lower than that of her smallest neighbor. She will be impotent even before Switzerland.

#### Conscription System Killed.

The conscription system will be knocked out by a 12-year enlistment requirement for the army which, it is understood, will be reduced to 100,000 men. What army she has, consequently, will be purely professional. The danger of Germany having four or five million trained men within the next 10 years, which would have been possible through conscription, will be abolished. All guns, munitions and equipment in excess of the amount necessary for her reduced army will be surrendered. It is understood also that the notorious general staff will be wiped out. If any attempt is made to carry out the threat to refuse acceptance of the peace treaty and throw the country into chaos if the terms are too harsh, Germany will find the Allies representing a firm front.

Blockade or Starve. The choice in such a case probably lies between occupation of Germany and continuation of the blockade, letting the enemy starve until they are ready to sign. Considering the comparative contentment in the present occupied portions of Germany, the latter course is considered more likely.

Under present plans the treaty will be handed to the Germans at Versailles immediately after their arrival there. The enemy delegates then will be allowed to return to Berlin or Weimar for consultation with their government, afterward coming back to Versailles for the formal signing. That Count Bernstorff will not be a member of the German delegation appeared certain today as the Allies have taken action to make clear that he would not be welcome.

The move of the Supreme War council in abolishing conscription in Germany was accepted as probably meaning the death blow to that system throughout the world. Under present political conditions in other European countries, it was believed this was the only interpretation which could be applied to the council's action.

### LAWS TO BAR ANARCHISTS

Will Be Urged in Congress by Investigating Committee.

Washington, March 12.—Drastic laws to curb activities of anarchists, I. W. W., social revolutionists and bolsheviks in the United States are to be recommended to congress by the senate committee which has been investigating bolshevik activities, members said.

Hearings are almost at an end. In spite of this, practically the only evidence the committee will have of bolshevik propaganda in the United States is yet to go into the record. Members of the committee declared legislation must be enacted that will:

- First—Keep agitators out of the country.
Second—Curb and punish those trying to undermine the government.
Third—Keep the teachings of bolshevism out of the malls and public prints.

### 8 BAY STATE TOWNS GO WET

Several Had Been Dry for More Than Quarter Century.

Boston, March 12.—Returns from 11 towns that voted on the question of issuing liquor licenses show that eight changed from dry to wet. Weymouth and Hingham, which have been no license places for more than a quarter of a century, and Scituate, with a dry record of 11 years, shifted to license. Easton, Rockland, Abington, Hudson and Ipswich also went wet.

### FLIGHT TO DULUTH IN 1:45

Minneapolis, March 12.—Lieutenant Larrabee and his brother, flying from Minneapolis, landed at Duluth at 12:15 p. m., completing the first non-stop flight between here and the head of the lakes in 108 minutes.

### Showing of Movie Restrained.

New York, March 12.—Exhibition of a banquet scene in a photoplay which depicts Countess von Bernstorff, wife of the former German Ambassador to the United States, as an accessory to a murder plot hatched by her husband, was restrained for three days by Justice Cahalan. Justice Cahalan reserved decision on an application for a temporary injunction pending an examination of briefs submitted by counsel for Pauline Lewis, who brought the suit on behalf of Countess von Bernstorff.
