TIME FOR TALK VIRTUALLY PAST

President Wilson Says Results on Peace Treaty Conferences Must Now Be Shown.

DELAY NO-ONE'S FAULT

Accepts His Share of Responsibility in Slowing Up Proceedings—Reds Offered Seat at Peace Table Conditionally.

Paris, April 2.—Commenting on the six amendments to the covenant of the League of Nations suggested by Elihu Root, it was stated by one of the legal specialists associated with the American peace conference delegation that he believed all the amendments were acceptable to the American delegation.

Paris, April 2.—President Wilson explained that he was willing to accept his share of responsibility for the peace conference delays. He was careful to point out that the slowness of the negotiations was not due to any single country or its representatives. He declared emphatically, however, that the time for talk was virtually finished and that now was the time to show results.

Offer Reds Conditional Seat.
London, April 2.—The Paris correspondent of the London Daily News says that Allied statesmen have submitted a proposition to the Russian soviet government whereby the bolsheviks would be admitted to the peace conference under certain conditions.

According to the correspondent, the bolsheviks would be required to cease financing propaganda, discontinue fighting and allow certain parts of Russia the right of self-determination. Premier Nicolai Lenin is understood to be agreeable to the proposal, the correspondent said.

Sends Delegates to Berlin.
Budapest, April 2.—The Hungarian government has sent a delegation to Berlin to conclude a treaty of alliance against the Entente Allies. German officers formerly belonging to Field Marshal Mackensen's army have arrived in Budapest to reorganize the Hungarian army along German lines. The army now numbers 100,000 men.

Czech troops who have been fighting the communists in southern Slovakia have captured the city of Kaschau, 140 miles northeast of Budapest, and other points. The German colonists in western Hungary and Transylvania are hostile to the communists and are attempting to establish their independence.

Women are joining the Red army. House rents have been reduced 20 per cent. The homes of the wealthy are being searched, and paintings and works of art are being requisitioned for the purpose of establishing national galleries, after the style of Moscow.

2 SOLDIERS CHOOSE SUICIDE

Broken in Health and Spirit by Service in War.
Chicago, April 2.—Broken in body and spirit, Privates Harvey Dorsey and Lester W. Bates returned from the war. Bates had an incurable wound in the back and Dorsey was suffering from shell shock. Dorsey is a suicide and Bates is missing and believed dead. Dorsey placed his head on a rail on an electric line and was decapitated by a train. Bates disappeared from the home of his employer, where he had been living since his return. He left a letter telling them he intended suicide.

FOCH OFF FOR CONFERENCE

Leaves Paris for Spa to Meet the German Envoy.
Paris, April 2.—Marshal Ferdinand Foch has left Paris for Spa to meet Mathias Erzberger to discuss with him the Allied demand that Polish troops be permitted to use the port of Danzig. The marshal has received full powers to negotiate with the German representative. He will be in constant communication with the council of four.

BANDITS ELUDE PURSUERS

First Suspects Taken in Kenosha Robbery Are Released.
Kenosha, Wis., April 2.—Search continues here and in nearby cities for bandits who murdered a policeman and robbed the American Brass company of \$50,000. Three men taken as suspects at McHenry, Ill., were released.

Was Result of Drunken Brawl.

Washington, April 2.—Reports to the State department on the recent clash between American and Japanese soldiers at Tientsin indicate it was a brawl originating in a disorderly house in the Japanese concession. A fight occurred there between five American soldiers and two Japanese. The next day a larger clash developed between American and Japanese soldiers in the French concession, but officials have not been able to determine whether the second disturbance was a result of the original fight.
